

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There is a story about a man who once visited a monastery. During his visit, he asked one of the monks, "What is your greatest regret in life?" The monk replied, "My greatest regret is never having *become* Christ." The man, a bit taken aback, asked, "How is that possible? Are we supposed to become Christ?" The monk, in turn, responded: "No Distance."

Lent is a long period within our liturgical life. 40 days of prayer, fasting, alms-giving! The big three that we only just heard proclaimed in the Gospel on Ash Wednesday just a few days ago. On top of that we practice abstinence from meat on Ash Wednesday and Fridays. We engage in prayerful practices and devotions, such as the *Stations of the Cross*. We often change our music, to reflect a more penitential way of thinking—asking God for forgiveness.



We engage in all of these activities, devotions and practices not simply for the sake of looking sorrowful and hungry and not because we want to show off who can kneel longer and faster during the *Stations of the Cross*.

No. We do this because we seek no distance.

Lent is a prayerful time to reflect on where our lives are and to assess, evaluate, examine our relationship with our God. Lent is a *journey* by which we seek to become closer to our God through practices of self-denial, prayer, and generosity. For it was Christ, himself, who through his life of self-denial, prayer and generosity offered his life for ours. During Lent, then, we imitate him, so that we can come

closer to him.

This weekend, our catechumens, who have been actively seeking to become a part of our Christian community through the process of RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation for Children), present themselves to the Archbishop. Last Sunday at the 10am Mass, they wrote their names into the *Book of the Elect*. They shared with us their desire to seek *no distance* with God. They desire to come into deeper communion with God, especially through the Church.

As we begin this Lenten journey, this is also an opportunity for each of us to reflect on our own call, as Christians, to grow closer to God. We are invited to reflect on ways that we can bridge the divide that separates us from closer communion with God and one another.

What are some prayers, devotions and practices that you can engage in this Lent, as you journey to closer relationship with God? Attend our 6:30pm Friday *Stations of the Cross*? Join a prayer group or bible study? Receive the sacrament of reconciliation? Or consider abstaining from something, in addition to meat, that will help you reflect more deeply on poverty of Christ who gave his life for us?

May we allow the ashes we prayerfully placed on our foreheads to be a reminder that we belong to God, and it is to God we return. Allow this Lenten journey be a time to seek closer relationship with Christ Jesus. Seek *no distance*.
