

GOSPEL MEDITATION 5th Sunday of Easter

A New Commandment: Love as I Have Loved You

An old priest once said, "Christianity is not rocket science—it's harder." Why? Because Christianity doesn't just ask us to believe certain truths—it calls us to live them out in love. And not just any kind of love, but a love modeled on Jesus Himself. In today's Gospel (John 13:31 –35), Jesus gives us a commandment that sounds simple but is incredibly demanding: "Love one another as I have loved you."

This moment takes place at the Last Supper, just after Judas leaves to betray Jesus. With the cross just hours away, Jesus does not speak of revenge or fear. He speaks of glory. "Now is the Son of Man glorified," He says. Why? Because He knows that love expressed through sacrifice—love that endures suffering—is the doorway to true glory. As we often say: "No cross, no crown."

Jesus then gives His disciples what He calls "a new commandment." Love, of course, is not a new concept—the Old Testament commanded it too. What's new is the measure of love: "as I have loved you." Jesus is raising the bar from loving our neighbor as ourselves to loving others as He loved us—completely, unconditionally, and sacrificially. This kind of love forgives, serves, and endures. It's not a feeling; it's a decision. Not sentimental, but cruciform.

Today, we joyfully celebrate with 29 of our young parishioners as they receive Jesus in the Holy Eucharist for the first time. What a fitting day for them to encounter the One who is Love Himself. In receiving Communion, they are not only receiving Jesus—they are being invited to live like Jesus. Every Eucharist is both a gift and a mission: to become what we receive. For our First Communicants, this is a beautiful beginning of a lifelong journey of faith, service, and love.

The saints show us what this kind of love looks like in real life. Saint Thérèse of Lisieux once said, "I understood that love comprises all vocations... My vocation is love." She didn't do big, dramatic things. She simply loved deeply in small, everyday ways. Saint Maximilian Kolbe offered his life in place of another man's at Auschwitz—a radical imitation of Christ's love. Mother Teresa reminds us: "Not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love."

Love like this changes the world—but first, it must change our hearts. Jesus said, "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples: if you love one another." Not by how often we go to church, not by how many prayers we say, but by how we treat each other. In our families, it might mean listening more patiently. In our parish, it could mean showing kindness to someone we find difficult. In our world, it might mean standing up for the forgotten or choosing mercy over judgment.

Today, let's ask ourselves:

- Do I love only when it's easy, or even when it's hard?
- Is my love visible in action—at home, at work, online?

What new step can I take this week to love someone as Jesus does?

And especially to our First Communicants: Jesus is now even closer to you. Let Him teach you how to love. Let Him be your strength when it's hard, and your joy when it's easy.

Let us all pray for the grace to love not only in word, but with our lives. May others recognize us as disciples of Jesus by the way we love. And may today's celebration renew in all of us the desire to love like Christ—sincerely, sacrificially, and joyfully. Amen.

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO V Domingo de Pascua



La palabra amor está muy trillada, es usada con mucha facilidad en nuestro lenguaje. Al decirla, quizá no pensamos en lo profundo de esta palabra. Hacemos tantas promesas de amor falsas. A la esposa, al esposo, a los hijos, a los amigos y a

tanta gente le decimos que la amamos cuando en realidad no es cierto. En este Domingo de Pascua, Jesús nuevamente lanza su invitación al amor, a dar la vida por el ser amado. "Les doy un mandamiento nuevo: que se amen los unos a los otros. Ustedes deben amarse unos a otros como yo los he amado" (Juan 13:34). Y agrega una frase más para que quede bien cimentado en nuestros corazones el significado de la palabra amor: "En esto reconocerán todos que son mis discípulos: en que se aman unos a otros" (Juan 13:35).

Esto es el amor evangélico; esto distingue mucho el significado de decir simplemente la palabra amor. El amor evangélico se vive en las dificultades más difíciles de la vida. Cuando los percances nos obligan a hacer cosas, aunque no queramos. Para así glorificarte en el sufrimiento de cualquier índole. Esta es la entrega que sublima tu Evangelio. Así es como se va aprendiendo a amar: la vida nos enseña a girar el corazón al amor. Reflexiona en lo siguiente: ¿En qué área de tu vida has experimentado el amor de Jesús? Si Jesús te dijera: "ama como yo te he amado", ¿cuál sería tu respuesta? En concreto, solo Jesús puede ayudarnos a renovar nuestra forma de amar a los demás.
