



From the Pastor's Desk

Living with Mercy


Because of the transformative Divine Mercy that Jesus bestowed upon His disciples from the Cross and then in His appearances after His Resurrection and then prior to His Ascension into Heaven, the early Christian community was able to live in a remarkable way. The First Reading (Acts 2:42-47) for the Second Sunday of the Easter Season states that,

"They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of bread and to the prayers. Awe came upon everyone, and many wonders and signs were done through the apostles. All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their property and possessions and divide them among all according to each one's need."

There was an intentionality to live as One Body of believers, united in their prayers by power of Christ in the Eucharist. I would imagine that there were still misunderstandings, arguments, and even occasional moments of discord (in fact this was described in varying passages from the Acts of the Apostles and some of the Letters of St. Paul) but there was nonetheless a pervasive reality of forgiveness and growth in authentic Communion. By God's Divine Mercy may our own hearts continually be renewed and strengthened and may our relationship with those around us improve for the greater Glory of the Lord. As we pray within the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have Mercy on us and on the whole world."

Reflections

Why Do We Do That?-Catholic Life Explained

Confession and First Communion

Question: Do children need to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before their First Communion?

Answer: For centuries the Catholic Church has taught that a person needs to be in a state of grace (free from mortal sins) in order to worthily receive the Eucharist. To that end, Catholics should make an effort to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation any time they recognize the need for the sacrament (and in keeping with the precept of the Church that asks that we celebrate this sacrament at least once each year).

In the case of children preparing for their First Communion, the Code of Canon Law is very clear that they should also celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation before receiving the Eucharist for the first time: "It is the responsibility, in the first place, of parents and those who take the place of parents as well as of the pastor to see that children who have reached the use of reason are correctly prepared and are nourished by the divine food as early as possible, preceded by sacramental confession" (Canon 914).

While some might question the significance of the Sacrament of Reconciliation — especially in the case of children who might not fully understand the reality of sin or the meaning of the sacrament itself — a child's "First Confession" can be a wonderful time for families to reflect together on the quality of their relationships, how they put their faith into practice, and, when it is possible, to celebrate the sacrament as a family. In the end, the celebration of these two sacraments marks important moments in the spiritual journeys of children and we hope their "First Confession" and "First Communion" help instill in them a love of the sacraments of the Church.

Gospel Meditation

2nd Sunday of Easter (Sunday of Divine Mercy)



A young, engaged couple sat on the couch in front of me as we chatted about their upcoming marriage. The young lady was struggling to trust her future husband. She told me her father had been unfaithful to her mother. She said of her fiancé, "I want him to prove to me that he won't cheat on me." The young man looked at me helplessly, raised his eyebrows and shrugged his shoulders. What evidence

could he possibly give to validate such a proof? Nothing. All he could do was invite her to trust him.

We all are wounded by experiences of imperfect love. We also are tempted to demand from God proof of His fidelity and goodness. We are like St. Thomas the Apostle who, on that second Sunday of Easter, demands proof of the Lord's resurrection. "Unless I see the mark of the nail ... I will not believe." Our science, technology and mathematics can indeed prove a great deal. But there are some things that require trusting another person. We prove promises of love only by trusting.

St. Thomas indeed saw the wounds of Jesus and believed. But there is an even greater blessing for us who simply trust Him — and all the truths the Church proclaims — because of the trustworthiness of the Risen One who speaks. This week let's trust Jesus without seeing him.

Did You Know?

Building for the church began early in the Summer of 1924. Plans were drawn by Jacob Gaul of Chicago and the contract was awarded to the firm Arrell & Suhring Company. On May 4th the soil was blessed and on July 6, 1924 the cornerstone of the Church of the Immaculate Conception in Columbia Heights was laid and blessed by the Right Reverend Monsignor James M. Cleary, Pastor of Incarnation Parish, Minneapolis. The last Sunday in August the sub-auditorium was in sufficient readiness for Divine Services.

The Doors We Lock

As a child, and even for a while as a teenager, I experienced an enormous amount of anxiety whenever I went to confession. For so many years I feared it. For so many years I waited in the confession line trembling, feeling sick to my stomach.

In the upper room after Christ's Passion and death, the anxiety of the disciples was so strong that they locked themselves away. But still Christ found a way into their midst. He would not be prevented from bringing mercy and hope to a place shrouded in despair. No door barred in a moment of fear could keep him out.

This is the genius of the sacrament of Reconciliation — and of all sacraments, really. Here we are, restricted in so many ways by an existence that is woefully physical. We feel fear, and our body reacts, just as we feel anger and our body reacts.

How can God deliver mercy to us in this flesh-bound state? Through that very flesh which can feel so confining. Through confession, which requires a physical action, and the physical participation not just of the penitent but of the priest.

I don't know how or why my anxiety around the sacrament has lessened over the years. Sometimes, I still feel it come roaring back unexpectedly, and maybe one day it will come back to stay. It doesn't surprise me: after all, I am in the flesh, and I will, as Peter says today, "suffer through various trials." But in all of them Christ will find me. He will not be kept away.


Eucharistic Adoration
