



## From the Pastor's Desk

#### **Counting Sheep**

On this fourth Sunday of the Easter season the universal church celebrates Jesus as the Good Shepherd. The readings during the Mass have implicit and explicit references to the Lord caring for His people like a shepherd cares for His flock.

Within the First Reading (Acts 2:14a, 36-41) we hear a message from St. Peter to the listening crowds in Jerusalem about the sacrificial offering that Jesus made of His life for the sake of the people, reminiscent of the shepherd who lays down his life for the sheep (John 10:11). The Responsorial Psalm 23 has the famous words of, "The Lord is my Shepherd" and speaks of the heartfelt concern that God has for the human race.

In the Second Reading we hear the striking words, "For you had gone astray like sheep, but you have now returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls" (1 Peter 2:25). As wandering sheep we repent of our former ways and turn back to Christ with a renewed vigor.

The Gospel (John 10:1-10) is a teaching moment from Jesus about the flock and His protective mercy for them. Interestingly Jesus says, "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep" (John 10:7) which was an anticipation of His later words at the Last Supper, "I am the Way and the Truth and the Life" (John 14:6). Our Lord and Savior desires to

lead us as proverbial sheep along this journey in the world to the green pastures of eternal rest. May we lovingly follow after Him so that we would be counted among His heavenly flock one day.

(P.S. In case you were counting among the readings and the verse before the Gospel there were nine references to "sheep" at the Mass today. Not baaaad!)



## (Practicing) Catholic

#### Cut to the Heart

Everyone who has been married knows this feeling: you're in the midst of a disagreement with your spouse. You've really dug in your heels. You're ready to die on this hill. And you have the awful, heartbreaking realization that you are wrong. Whatever it is you're arguing about, you're wrong. You.

So where do you go from here? The only way forward is to own it. Fess up. Grab a fork and dig into that humble pie. It makes me cringe just to write about it, because it's the worst feeling.

I use the example of marriage because it's the one I'm most familiar with — my closest relationship, the one that teaches me the most about who I am and who God asks me to be. But this is a universal experience, and everyone — single or married, child or adult, lay or ordained — knows how badly it feels to realize that you're wrong. You're human. You messed up.

It is hard to recognize that the Christian life is one of ongoing repentance. It is painful to acknowledge the ways in which we are falling short, even as we strive to follow in Christ's example.

It can, in the words of today's reading, "cut to the heart."

But that feeling of despair is what propels forward motion. We have to allow ourselves to feel bad, that's the fertile ground of penitence. We are meant to have not just life, but life "more abundantly." Stasis isn't the goal. Baptism isn't the finish line.

Examining our conscience is hard. It cuts to the heart. It cuts to the truth.



## Reflections

#### Why Do We Do That?-Catholic Life Explained

#### Genuflecting & Kneeling

Question: Does it matter what leg you kneel on when genuflecting?

**Answer:** Genuflection is an act of devotion that literally means "to bend the knee." For many Catholics, it's an almost automatic gesture that we perform before entering our pew or row of seats at Mass. But, like many of the symbols and gestures of our faith tradition, genuflecting can also be an invitation for deeper reflection.

The practice of "bending the knee" is an ancient way of recognizing the presence of someone greater than we are. It has been said that the practice dates back to the time of Alexander the Great, but it became a common part of etiquette in the royal courts of the Middle Ages. From throne rooms and palaces, it was a small step to genuflecting, becoming part of the devotional lives of Christians who used this secular gesture as a way of recognizing the presence of the One who is King of Kings, especially in the Eucharist. In our tradition, although many have been taught or prefer to genuflect by placing their right knee on the ground, there is no prescribed way to genuflect. This is especially important to keep in mind if physical limitations or age make certain movements difficult for us.

Today, Catholics are asked to genuflect in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament (whether in the tabernacle or exposed on the altar during eucharistic adoration). So, while it has become second nature to genuflect before entering your seat in church, we should pay attention to where the Blessed Sacrament is kept in each church or chapel we visit, and genuflect in the direction of the tabernacle where the Blessed Sacrament is kept. In churches or chapels in which the tabernacle is in a separate space, we are invited to simply bow toward the altar.

#### Live the Liturgy-Inspiration for the Week

We know the voice of our shepherd. We know he speaks a language of love, of patience, of long-suffering sacrifice. The voice of the thief will offer us freedom, but it is a freedom that ends in destruction. There is only one gate that leads to everlasting life.



## **Gospel Meditation**

4th Sunday of Easter



I recently rescued a dog. She's a terrier and rather adorable. And she's crazy about me. She could spend all day with me. But I'm a pastor at a parish and sometimes I leave her at the front desk of the church office. She constantly amazes me by her ability to distinguish between my voice and that of everyone else. If I say one word, even if I'm hidden around a corner, she'll sprint toward me and


jump up into my arms.

This week the readings focus our attention to the *voice* of the risen Jesus Christ. Comparing his disciples to sheep and himself to a shepherd, he says, "They recognize his voice." He speaks to us and wants us to respond. When we hear his voice, we follow. Throughout this coming week, we will experience many interior promptings to receive God's love, and to love Him in return. That's his voice. Follow it into the safe and tender arms of Christ.

By contrast, some voices we will hear do not convey God's concern and love for us, but rather produce fear, despair, and other harmful mischief. Jesus calls these voices those of robbers. Does an idea or thought make it harder for you to love God? If so, run away. Let it go. It is most likely not the voice of the Risen Lord. Keep waiting for him to speak. You will recognize his voice. Then run to him as fast as you can.

#### Saint Athanasius of Alexandria | Catholic Saints

#### Did You Know?

By 1938, Immaculate Conception Parish grew to approximately 450 families. Archbishop Murray asked Father Rolwes to build a school. Because Father Rolwes felt the condition of his health did not warrant such an undertaking, Archbishop Murray transferred him and appointed Reverend J.F. Lapinski on January 9, 1938. Father Lapinski broke ground for the school May 25, 1939. The corner stone was laid on August 14<sup>th</sup> of that same year. When the building was complete that fall, school opened with 224 students occupying six of the nine classrooms. Seven Sisters of the Order of St. Francis, one of whom was a house-keeper, staffed the school and lived in three rooms on the south end of the school. The first principal was Sister M. Loretto Stalock.
