Greetings and welcome to summer! As I look back over the last month or so, I think about how blessed we have been to witness so many of the sacraments in just a short time. We have had the opportunity to celebrate these sacraments which are so vital to our well being, both spiritually and physically.

We had the opportunity to participate in the sacrament of anointing of the sick where at the Anointing Mass anyone in need of healing was able to attend Mass and be anointed. We observed the sacrament of holy orders when four young men of our archdiocese were ordained into the priesthood and where we celebrated Father James' 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his ordination with a reception in Fellowship Hall. We've had a number of baptisms in our parish which allowed us to witness the sacrament of baptism. Most recently, we saw 51 of our children receive the sacraments of reconciliation and first Eucharist. Seeing all those children dressed in their finest dresses and suits reminded me of my first Communion and how special that time was. This year we are beginning the second year of Eucharistic Revival. The revival's purpose is to bring back to the forefront the sacredness and importance of the Eucharist. This is a sacrament we can receive over and over by receiving Communion whenever possible. Perhaps over the next year, with many educational opportunities and events happening as part of the revival, we can increase our personal awareness of the Eucharist being the actual presence of the Body and Blood of Jesus and realize just how blessed we are to be able to receive Jesus in this sacrament.

I look forward to seeing all of you at church and at our picnic, and may God bless you as you encounter and receive Jesus in the sacrament of holy Eucharist!
