ADMINISTRATION

You have the tools to build the kingdom of God. Pass them on well worn.

Finance Council

Meet once a month (except July). Review monthly financial statements. Support and advise the pastor in his stewardship of the parish financial resources.

Money Counting

Help count the weekend collections and prepare the bank deposit. The commitment is every other Monday morning for two hours.

Grounds and Maintenance Committee

Meet once a month. Responsibilities include planning for capital improvements, identifying maintenance needs, and working with the maintenance staff and parish business administrator to obtain objectives.

Parish Council

Meet bi-monthly (except July). The council provides consultative support and assistance to the Pastor. Its goal is to identify and meet the pastoral, spiritual, and temporal needs of the parish community and to provide leadership for parishioners.

Council of Catholic Women (CCW)

CCW supports, empowers and educates women in spirituality, leadership and service. All women in the parish automatically belong to CCW. This is an avenue in which women can enjoy fellowship and also respond to the needs of the parish and greater community.

IC Summer Jam

This is Immaculate Conception's biggest event, which runs over three days. Volunteers are needed for event set-up/take down, games, food, beverages, silent auction, youth activities, money counting, and marketing.

FAITH FORMATION

Adult Formation

Volunteers are needed to help lead bible studies and faith enrichment events.

Charismatic Prayer Group

This group meets every Tuesday evening from 7:00 to 9:00. Prayer meetings typically include a period of praise and worship followed by a faith sharing or a talk by a member of the prayer group or a guest speaker. The meeting ends with social fellowship.

Confirmation

Catechists are needed for the Confirmation team, which plans and presents lessons to our candidates.

Confirmation Retreat

Volunteers are needed to assist with the Confirmation retreat.

Family Formation (Grades K-6)

Catechists are needed to assist in the preparation of a lesson for the

first Wednesday of the month from September through May. They also meet for instruction on the month's topic. Plan and assist with the FFCC (Family Formation Community Connection) evening for the families.

Junior High Formation

Catechists prepare lessons and then meet with students three Mondays a month from September through May.

Liturgy of the Word

Volunteers teach the readings to Pre-k through 2nd grade children during the 10:00 Mass.

RCIA/RCIC

Sponsors are needed for the candidates going through the initiation programs for joining the Catholic Faith. Sponsors commit to accompany the catechumen or candidate during his/her formation period.

Vacation Faith Formation

Adult and teen volunteers lead children, Pre-K through 5th grade, in a week of faith and fun filled activities. This event takes place during the last week in June from 8:00 am to 12:00 pm.

Youth Activities

Event coordinators are needed. Volunteers are also needed to assist with and chaperone at various youth events, some of which are overnight.

LITURGY

Adoration

"Could you not spend one hour with me?" Grow spiritually each moment you spend with Jesus. Sign up to spend one hour a week in our Adoration chapel in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

Altar Server

Assist the priest during Mass. This is open to all adults and children 4th Grade and older.

Art and Environment

This is the group that plans, organizes, decorates the church for each liturgical season; Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, Lent, Triduum, and Easter. Time commitment is 5 to 10 hours per season.

Church Servant

Do you like to do behind the scenes work? This group is for you. Help clean and set the church up during the week in preparation for the weekend Masses.

Eucharistic Minister

Distribute the Eucharist (both species) to the assembly. This ministry is open to members 16 years of age and older who have been confirmed.

Greeter

Create a welcoming atmosphere by greeting parishioners as they enter the Church for Mass. This is a great family ministry!

Lector

Must have good reading skills and a clear voice. Lectors read the

word of God during weekend liturgies. This is open to adults and youth (7th grade and older).

Lending Library

Vacuum and dust the library weekly. Dust book shelves and window ledges as needed. Straighten rooms of books and make sure everything is picked up and neat.

Linen Caretaker

Take care of and clean the various linens used for liturgical celebrations.

Liturgy Commission

Plan and set policies for the liturgical life of the parish. The committee meets one Wednesday morning a month from 9:00 to 10:30 am.

Sacristan

Make sure that the altar and sanctuary are in complete readiness for the Mass. This would include ensuring the sound system is on, all items needed for the Communion are in their proper places, and that there are enough hosts and unconsecrated wine available

Usher

Assist with the weekend Masses by helping parishioners find seating at weekend Masses, take up the collection, and ensure that people go up to the altar in an organized fashion for Communion. Open to anyone at least six years of age.

Music

Adult Choir

Lead the assembly in singing at a Sunday morning Mass. The commitment is September through May; also singing at major feast days. Open to 9th grade students through adults. Rehearsals are on Wednesday evening from 7:00 to 9:00 pm.

IC Music Presents

Join us in the variety show and dinner fundraiser. We also need volunteers to decorate, clear tables, wash dishes, and clean the kitchen.

Cantor

Lead the assembly in singing at the weekend Masses. You need not be a member of the choir. Rehearsals are set between you and the accompanist.

Funeral Schola

The Schola sings for all funerals and is open to all adults. Members are called as funerals occur and meet one half-hour prior to the funeral to rehearse. Members are not expected to sing for every funeral due to their inconsistent scheduling, but are welcome to join when able.

Care Center Visits, Hospital, and Homebound Ministry

Visit parishioners who are hospitalized, homebound or living in local care centers. Bring them support, company, and the Eucharist.

Communion Services/Off-Site Masses

Escort residents to the chapel and back. Participate in the liturgy with them.

Funeral Lunches

Help support our funeral ministry by serving a catered lunch to funeral guests. This also includes washing dishes and cleaning the kitchen afterwards.

Lenten Soup Lunches

Help prepare and serve soup for lunch on specified Fridays in Lent. Lunch is served from 11:30 am to 1:00 pm. Washing dishes and cleaning the kitchen afterwards is also required. You can volunteer for one or more lunches each Lenten season.

Prayer Blankets

Assist in cutting and hand stitching of small fleece blankets that are given to the sick.

Prayer Tree

Pray in the privacy of your home for those who request prayers, all communication is by phone.

Food Service

Assist Food Service Manager with setting up food for easy distribution to serve to the students at lunch. This requires approximately an hour and a half of time. Work one day a week from 10:45 am-12:15 pm or more.

Marathon

Volunteers are needed to help out with this major school fundraiser that takes place on the first Saturday morning in October Areas of need include patrol guards on the marathon route.

Classroom Support

Volunteers would assist a classroom teacher with student support, tutoring or other tasks.

Book Fair

This event is held during Catholic Schools Week at the end of January. Volunteers would assist customers and students to select and purchase books.

Queen of May Dinner and Auction for Catholic Education

This is a major school fundraiser that is held on the first Friday in May. Help is needed in room decorating, bussing dishes, washing dishes, and the silent auction. The success of this event is very gratifying!

Coaching

Concessions Stand

Volunteers are needed to work at the concession stand during home games and tournaments. Responsibilities would include making popcorn and hot dogs, selling the various foods and beverages, and cleaning up at the conclusion of the event.

Sell Tickets

Volunteers would sell tickets to the home games and tournaments.

Operating Principles:

Action:

Brothers Keepers

A group of skilled quilters come together on Friday mornings to design and sew large quilts that are distributed to Bridging (largest furniture bank in North America) and other shelters for people in need.

Catholic Charities Opportunity Center-Branch III

The Church of the Immaculate Conception serves a full breakfast at Catholic Charities Opportunity Center, formally known as Branch III, the second Saturday of each month. The Opportunity Center is a service of Catholic Charities of St. Paul and Minneapolis, and is located downtown Minneapolis. It provides a place for those experiencing homelessness to connect with resources to help move toward self-sufficiency.

Coins for Social Justice

Coins for Social Justice, raises funds to support programs that promote the gospel of peace and social justice. The fourth weekend of each month, IC parishioners are asked to fill the collection basket with their pocket change to benefit the Social Justice Ministry. The funds are then distributed to agencies or organizations in need; the Social Justice Committee discerns where the funds go.

Feed My Starving Children

During Lent M&M tubes are distributed after all Masses and parishioners are encouraged to fill the tubes with quarters and return to Immaculate Conception, proceeds going to Feed My Starving Children.

Giving Tree

Each year volunteers from IC Parish and families from the IC Faith Formation program gather to set up Christmas trees which are then decorated with gift request ornaments. Parishioners are asked to select an ornament or two, purchase the gift on the ornament, and return it to the church. Volunteers then sort the gifts and prepare them for pick up by the various charities we serve.

Socks For The Soul

October we collect socks and small personal hygiene items for our annual Sock Drive. All donated socks and hygiene items are distributed by volunteers to clients of Catholic Charities Opportunity Center formally known as Branch III and SACA, who provide supportive services for the poor and homeless in our community.
