Eligibility to be a Sponsor

For a person to act as a sponsor for Baptism/Confirmation, they must receive a letter from the parish to which he or she belongs, stating: he or she is at least sixteen years old, must have already received all the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist). He or she must be able to fulfill the responsibilities involved with being a sponsor. A sponsor who is married must be married in accord with the laws of the Catholic Church.

News from Fr. Reilly's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Trust rooted in experience is at the heart of our faith. First there was Abraham, our father in faith. The second reading recalls his story: God called him in his old age, promising a change in his life, a new season of prosperity and fruitfulness in a new land. Abraham trusted God and left his home in obedience. He began to receive what was promised, the realization of what he hoped for.

Abraham died before entering the promised land, never seeing it himself. But his life experiences were evidence enough for him never to lose trust in God's providence. As God continued to provide, Abraham's trust grew and deepened. Thus, his faith was a gift from God, who chose Abraham to be the father of faith to all his people.

Generations later Abraham's descendants, the Israelites, become captives in Egypt. They know how God provided for Abraham and what has been promised to them as their inheritance. With this evidence, they trust in God and have courage as they wait to see his justice. Like Abraham, they obey God's instructions although imperfectly. Thus, as the Book of Wisdom tells us, their households are spared on the night of Passover as their adversaries are driven to surrender. Now they, too, have seen the realization of what was hoped for.

The Israelites inherit the land God promised – though by the time of the Gospel it is under occupation. Still, the disciples have the privilege of seeing and knowing the Messiah, fully realizing what generations had hoped for. Jesus assures them that they can be confident in God's desire to fulfill his promises to them. He says, Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom. The true promised land – heaven – will be opened to them by the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Indeed, God is fulfilling his promises through Christ in ways the Israelites never would have expected.

As God provided for Abraham, the Israelites, and the disciples, we can trust him to continue to provide for us. We can be like the vigilant servants, ever ready for the realization of what we hope for. Our waiting will not be in vain.

The Eucharist is our nourishment as vigilant servants, as it is Christ himself and a foretaste of the heavenly banquet and eternal union we are offered in him. As evidence of things we have yet to see, Jesus' self-gift in the Blessed Sacrament grows and deepens our trust if we receive him with love.

Next Generation Parish

Saints Peter and Paul recently completed the Next Generation Parish program we started in 2021

Our first three-year strategic plan (2022 - 2025) was recently completed, and now we will embark on the plan for 2026 - 2029.

But before forging ahead, our parish NGP team completed an Assess and Learn process. This process looks back over what we learned and accomplished as a parish during implementation of our 2022-25 strategic plan. By priority area, these outcomes were:

- Developing Personal and Communal Holiness enabled us to launch small discussion groups ("Beyond Sundays") and an ongoing speaker series in our parish.
- Celebrating Uplifting and Meaningful Liturgies facilitated a better understanding and appreciation of the Mass through The Mass Explained video series, and helped to organize a workshop for liturgical ministers.
- Fostering Relationships to Develop Community brought new and long-time parishioners together in a mentoring relationship, and launched a parish Instagram account.
- Increasing Personal Outreach Experience, gave rise to our Helping Other People Everyday (HOPE) program, with volunteers assisting parishioners in need with all kinds of services and support.

Soon we will be sharing the priority areas our team agreed to focus on for our 2026-29 strategic plan. By focusing on a limited number of parish priorities in each plan, we accelerate progress toward achieving our mission of being "a community of Catholics growing spiritually while serving and leading people to Christ."

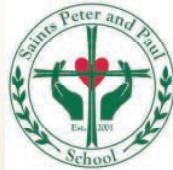

Call for Sponsors

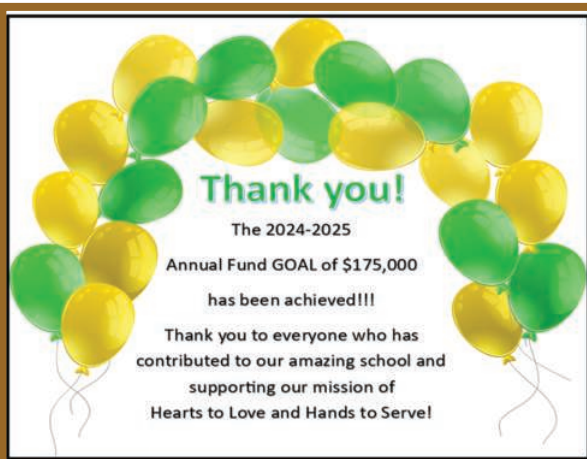
Preparations are well underway for the annual Golf and Pickle Ball event at Penn Oaks in West Chester. A Saints Peter and Paul favorite, this is a day of fun, sun, and comradery as we gather together to support the Teacher Enrichment Fund for our amazing parish school.

This fund provides necessary financial resources to support Professional Development, Advanced Degree Education and Performance Recognition for our very hard working and dedicated teaching professionals. Currently, parochial teachers earn significantly less than their public-school counterparts. In our immediate area, comparing teachers with 5 years of experience across West Chester, Downingtown, Exton, and SSPP, on average, our teachers earn only about 66.6% of what the public-school teachers take home. That is a delta of over \$21,000 per year! The gap only widens as years of experience and achievement of advanced degrees takes place.

Support of the Golf and Pickle Ball event is critical to insure we are able to keep our teachers up-to-date on recent advances in technology and teaching methodologies. Being able to assist in tuition expenses for advanced degrees raises the overall quality of the educational experience for all our children. Background checks and clearances are required.

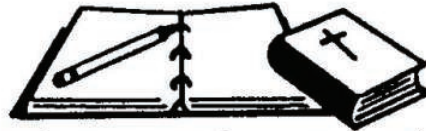

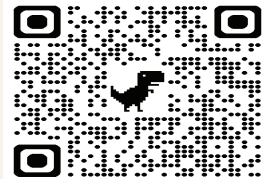

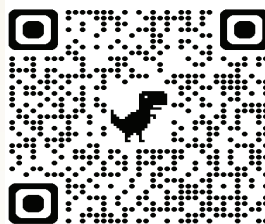
