Eligibility to be a Sponsor

For a person to act as a sponsor for Baptism/Confirmation, they must receive a letter from the parish to which he or she belongs, stating: he or she is at least sixteen years old, must have already received all the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist). He or she must be able to fulfill the responsibilities involved with being a sponsor. A sponsor who is married must be married in accord with the laws of the Catholic Church.

News from Fr. Reilly's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

If someone were to ask us, "What do you need today?" how might we answer? We might not even reflect or have the time to know the answer – the true answer to this important question. Or perhaps we know but allow ourselves to be sidetracked or numbed by something less than what we truly need.

For example, many of us might need rest – to slow our pace. Or perhaps we need more quality time with loved ones, or more time for prayer. Perhaps what we truly need is growth in discipline and self-control, or someone who can offer us encouragement and accountability.

"What do you need?" is a question worthy of our attention and reflection. We know we are struggling, but we don't know where to start to find the peace for which we long.

The Gospel speaks to this challenge. God will not fail to answer if we ask him where our deepest needs lie. If we bring this essential question to him, he will answer. In telling the parable of the widow and judge – who makes a decision for the widow because she is persistent – Jesus says, Pay attention to what the dishonest judge says. Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night? Will he be slow to answer them? I tell you, he will see to it that justice is done for them speedily.

Ultimately, regardless of the specifics of our lives, if we dig deep enough, if we take the time to reflect and pray with this question, we will always arrive at the same answer: we need God. What we long for is infinite, it knows no end. And the only source of infinite goodness is God. We can, and must, persist in our entreaties to him, for he alone is the source of our good, and the source of all things.

Many scripture readings emphasize this need. Whether we are facing a battle of some sort, or need to be equipped for every good work, we must persistently turn to the source of everything good, and true, and beautiful. God is faithful and will respond to our truest needs.

Let us receive Jesus with joy when we come to the Eucharistic table. Let us trust his generosity, made tangible in this sacrament. And let us open our hearts to be guided as we go forth from this place.

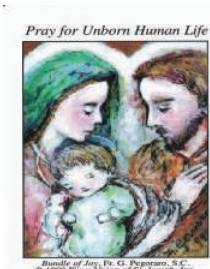

You may adopt a child individually or as a family by simply picking up a prayer card after Mass next weekend.

Using the prayer on the back of the card, you will be asked to pray daily for 9 months for the unborn child and all unborn children, for the power of prayer is great.

You can name the child for whom you are praying, thereby giving the baby the humanity he or she deserves.

There will be monthly reports in the bulletin describing your baby's development. There are millions of unborn babies desperately in need of your prayers. Won't you please spiritually adopt one and share the love for life that God has given you?

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On October 19, we celebrate World Mission Sunday, a powerful reminder of our shared responsibility to proclaim the Gospel to all nations. This year's theme, *"Missionaries of Hope Among the Peoples,"* is particularly moving and bridges two pontificates. It was chosen by Pope Francis and reflects both the heart of our faith along with the vision of Pope Leo XIV.

Our new Holy Father spent most of his priestly ministry as a Missionary in the remote regions of Peru. He reminds us that the Pontifical Mission Societies are "the primary means for awakening Missionary responsibility among all the baptized and to support pastoral communities in areas where the Church is young." His personal witness deepens the meaning of this year's celebration, inviting all of us to renew our commitment to the Church's Mission in the world.

It is important to remember that the Catholic Church in the United States was once itself a Mission area. Just over a century ago, the faith here was still taking root. We were sustained by the generosity of Catholics from Europe and beyond, who provided financial assistance, sent priests and Religious and helped build the parishes and schools that formed the foundation of the Church in this country. In those early years, Catholics in Philadelphia benefited from the same collection we are today invited to support.

Now, we can extend that same generosity to others. Your financial support will directly assist the Missionaries, priests, Religious sisters and brothers and lay leaders who serve in the 1,111 Mission areas spanning Africa, Asia, Latin America, Oceania and the Middle East, who depend on our prayers and help to sustain and expand their efforts to share Christ and His saving Gospel.

I encourage you to respond with a generous heart, knowing that your gifts will make a real difference in the lives of those who might otherwise never hear the Gospel. The Church's Mission is not the responsibility only of those who serve in distant lands; it belongs to all of us by baptism.

May this World Mission Sunday deepen our commitment to the Missionary dimension of our faith. Let us go forth as Missionaries of Hope, bringing God's love and mercy to all people.

When you are done, Place it somewhere to remind you to pray every day.



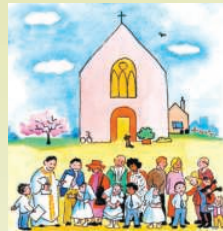
Dear Families,
