July 11th is the Solemnity of Saint Benedict, our Patron. (We will be observing this solemnity at all Masses the weekend of July 8/9.) Saint Benedict was

born into a distinguished family in central Italy, studied at Rome and early in life was drawn to the monastic life. At first he became a hermit, leaving a depressing world—pagan armies on the march, the Church torn by schism, people suffering from war, morality at a low ebb.

He soon realized that he could not live a hidden life in a small town any better than in a large city, so he withdrew to a cave high in the mountains. Some monks chose him as their leader for a while, but found his strictness not to their taste, and so he set out to live his life according to the call of God. He then was able to realize his idea of gathering monks into one monastery to give them the benefit of unity, fraternity, permanent worship in one house. His idea of a monastery was eventually realized in what has become one of the most famous monasteries in the world: Monte Cassino outside of Rome.

He wrote a *Rule*, which he said was for beginners, that gradually developed a life of liturgical prayer, study, manual labor and living together in community under a common father (abbot). Benedictine asceticism is known for its moderation, and Benedictine hospitality and charity has always shown concern for others. It is this spiritual heritage that the monks of Saint Joseph Abbey have shared with those on the northshore, and specifically the people of St. Benedict Church.

As we honor this great saint this month, may he, our patron, lead us to become men of prayer, community, work, and hospitality.

Paul moved to accept the recommendation and Wayne seconded. Motion adopted.

Mel gave members a schedule of upcoming events for the Society. The list included the installation of Officers at the 10:30 Mass on June 25 and a dinner at Young's Steak House on July 6.

New Business

Workers are needed for the Confirmation Retreat on August 13 which will take place at St. John's in Folsom.

The Biker Race Meal is cancelled due to building construction.

Additional discussion involved the fish fry and whether to share with the KC's and getting the youth group to assist in the serving.
