

## What You Need to Know as you Prepare

There are many decisions that need to be made in preparation for a loved one's funeral. The St. Thomas Becket funeral staff and volunteers will assist and guide you through the entire process.

Many people are overwhelmed when faced with any sort of decision making during the initial stages of grief. We will answer your questions and offer suggestions. Please read through this funeral guide to make choices that you feel are best. You are not limited to the Scripture readings and music in this guide. Please let us know as we meet to plan your loved one's service what you would prefer.

Please fill out as much as you can in the *information* you need for the family planning meeting section of this guide and bring it with you when we meet to make final plans for the celebration of your loved one's life.

# Scheduling a Funeral Mass and Luncheon at Church:

The date of the funeral is dependent on the day of death, schedule of the family, funeral home, schedule of the Priest and facility availability.

## **Funeral Visitation Options:**

A Visitation may be held at the funeral home the evening before the funeral Mass AND / OR

A Visitation may be held one hour before the Funeral Mass at St Thomas Becket.

## Type of Funeral:

Mass with the body present


Mass with the body present and cremation later

Mass with cremated remains present

Visitation and Mass all on one day

Rite of Christian Burial without a Mass at the funeral home or church

Memorial Mass or service when the body or cremated remains are not present



## **A Family Funeral Planning Meeting**

The St. Thomas Becket funeral staff, Fr Tim Wozniak (Pastor), Chris Angel (Music Director), and Mary McDonald (Pastoral Associate) will want to meet with you and your close family members shortly after the death of your loved one. This meeting will last 1 ½ - 2 hours so we have time to hear about the story and attributes of your loved one's life, choose the scripture readings and music, consider who of your family and friends may participate in and before the Mass by; sharing the remarks of remembrance, carrying the urn (or pall bearers), carrying a photo for display during Mass, readings, offering of the gifts, prayers of the faithful or serving as a Eucharistic Minister. This is also the time to plan the luncheon detail if you choose to do this onsite.

### Remarks of Remembrance

The opportunity for remarks of remembrance about your loved one takes place in the Church, when all are seated before the Mass begins.

One person is invited to share a 3-6 - minute reflection of the deceased person's life. These remarks include the most meaningful and memorable things about your loved one. Remarks are to be written down.

Bullet points followed by a sentence or two will keep the words of remembrance clear and focused.

If you feel that more people will want to offer remarks, we can provide a microphone and podium in the Commons so people can share freely during the luncheon.

## Display of Photos and Memorabilia

Set up for the funeral is done prior to the Visitation and Mass. The Visitation is about one hour (10am – 10:50am) before the Mass (11am – Noon). Families and readers are asked to arrive by 9:30am.

Families are encouraged to bring photos and memorabilia to display in the Commons. Easels for picture boards are provided and some tables of various sizes. We also have a limited choice of medium to large flower vases. Families may also put together a video presentation of the life of the deceased to display on the Commons television monitors. This requires that the family bring a ready USB or jump drive to plug into the monitors (use one or both). There is no sound to accompany the rolling display of photos.

Families are encouraged to bring a guest book and if desired, print a remembrance / prayer card honoring the deceased (printing is not done at STB).

# Choosing Scripture Readings for the Funeral Mass

Choose one reading from the Old Testament and one reading from the New Testament. The Psalm is usually sung, (see music suggestions) and the Presider of the Mass will choose a suitable Gospel reading.

The following list of readings are suggestions, please feel free to choose different Scripture readings if you prefer something else.

## **Old Testament Readings**

Isaiah 40: 28-31 – They that hope in the Lord, will run and not grow weary

Wisdom 3: 1-6, 9 – The souls of the just are in the hand of God

Isaiah 43:1-5 – Do not be afraid for I am with you

Isaiah 25: 6,7-9 - God will wipe away tears from all faces

Ecclesiastes 3:1-11- To everything there is a season

Proverbs 31:10-12,15-18, 20-21,25-31- A worthy wife, her value is far beyond pearls

Sirach various verses – a faithful friend, a good husband, loves his children

## **New Testament Readings**

Romans 8:31,38-39 – nothing can separate us from the love of God

Philippians 4:4-7 – rejoice in the Lord always, dismiss anxiety from your minds

2 Timothy 4:7-9 17-18 – I have competed well, finished the race, kept the faith

Colossians 3:12-17 – be clothed in sincere compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience

- 1 Thessalonians 5:11,15-18 21-23 encourage and build each other up, be joyful, pray continually
- 1 Corinthians' 12: 31 13:8a love is patient, love is kind, bears all things, hopes & endures all things

Thessalonians 4: 13-18 - grieve, and hope in the Lord

## **Burial**

Burial is done immediately following the Funeral Mass, after the luncheon or at a future time.

#### The cemetery is the family's choice. Here are three area possibilities:

**Resurrection Cemetery** – is the closest of the Catholic Cemeteries in our Archdiocese. It is located at Lexington and Highway 110. The family or Funeral Home can make an appointment for you to meet and select the burial site.

Fort Snelling – is located in Minneapolis, internments may be scheduled by the Funeral Home. All burials there are scheduled by appointment. The deceased must be a Veteran or family member of a Veteran. Phone – 612-726-1127

# Suggested Ways to Use the Material in this Booklet

#### Planning a funeral for a family member

This material can help you have a head start on planning the Funeral Mass.

Knowing the questions that will be asked of you ahead of time will help you to begin thinking about what your family might choose to do for your loved one.

#### Pre-planning your own funeral

We all want to have some say about our lives; and this is one way we can have something to say about our dying and funeral arrangements. There are many decisions that must be made in a relatively short time, and it is a great comfort and relief to have the funeral liturgy planned in advance.

#### Planning with a Family Member who is dying

Planning the funeral Mass for a dying loved one can be a very rewarding and meaningful experience. Reading and talking through scriptures and songs can create an opportunity for sharing faith and life stories. Your loved one will be so grateful that you want to share the process with them.

#### Having a discussion with your family on death and dying

Very often we think of this discussion as being morbid. But it can become a most

life-giving exchange. It can be a wonderful sharing with each other about our hopes, fears and concerns around death and dying; and a great comfort to know that you have told others about your funeral wishes. We also can learn and even

be surprised by what each other thinks, values and wants. Consider sharing funeral planning with loved ones.

## **Parish Funeral Costs:**

#### A \$250 donation to the Church includes:

Keyboard - \$150 Facilities - \$100

#### Other Costs:

- Cantor (by separate check please) \$150
- Funeral Lunch Charge \$7 per estimated guest
- Funeral Reception Charge \$4 per estimated guest
- Catered Luncheon If the family chooses to have the meal catered, the charge is \$2 per estimated guest to pay for compostable paper and silver ware products. Before service, all caterers are required to provide proof of a 1-million-dollar certificate of liability insurance waiver that includes documentation that St Thomas Becket is additionally insured.
- Live Streaming Charge / \$150 if desired (by separate check please.)

  Streaming is available only if a technician can be engaged by the parish. The family may hire a live streamer, but they must use their own equipment. We will assist them with placement.

If a **slide show** is desired the family may use the parish TV monitors in the Commons. Please bring a USB/Memory stick with your photos or video (make sure either they are all photos or a video). Another option is to bring your laptop ready with pictures loaded.

## **Parish Hospitality Options:**

#### #1. No hospitality desired

**#2.** Luncheon – available mid-day to families for groups of 200 attendees or less. **Menu includes** ham and turkey bread rolls, salads, potato chips, desserts, coffee and lemonade. Condiments provided. The approximate cost is **\$7 per person**.

#### #3. Dessert and Coffee Reception

Coffee, lemonade, fruit and assorted dessert trays are available for family and friend gatherings of any size. The approximate cost is \$3 per person.

#### #4 Catered -

The parish funeral committee will be happy to serve a catered luncheon for the family at no cost. The family is responsible for ordering the meal and having it delivered to St Thomas Becket. The Caterer must provide liability insurance in advance. The Parish cost for compostable paper and silverware is **\$2 per guest**.

What remains from the luncheon is repackaged and given to the family.
