Advent Waiting

We all ache for God, and we wait...

The addict in the alley behind the Cathedral waits: for a God who will come and remove all that enslaves him.. The single mother waits: for the day when she longer has to

work 54 hours.

when she can sleep eight, and when she'll finally know the kids will be ok.

The soldier in a ditch in Iraq waits: for a morning when there are no more explosions of IEDs,

and every look is not feared as the precursor to an assault, and you don't have to bury your new best friends.

The old man in the nursing home waits: for the day he will no longer be alone,

when pain will no longer be his most constant companion, and when he can once again rest in the embrace of her whom

The prisoner on death row waits:

for a place where he will no longer be seen as evil, for a life that makes sense,

for a time when love can be given and received, for the coming of a God who will love him.

The investment banker waits: for the day when he's not gripped by the fear

that he's about to lose everything,

for the day when he can count his value

in the quality of his love rather than the size of his profit. The little child waits within her mother's womb:

for a world that will welcome her, and parents that will love

and a country who will protect her.

We all wait in joyful hope, with bated breath, as we gaze toward the Eastern skies in expectation of the one who rises with healing in his wings...

Exiled in a Babylon of our own selfishness, we cry out: "rend the heavens, O Lord, and come down to us!" Yet he waits for us in that confessional, ready to embrace us pick us up on his shoulders and carry us home to himself.

Family Advent Prayers The Fourth Week of Advent

Prepare: Put out the shepherds and the sheep and any other animals, as well as the Advent wreath. Light all 4 candles on the Ad-vent wreath and lower the lights, preparing for prayer.

All: Lord, we gather with the people who waited one thousand years for your coming.

Reader 1: A reading from the gospel according to Luke: (Luke 2:6-12) While they were in Bethlehem, the time came for Mary to have her baby. She gave birth to her first son, wrapped in cloths, and laid him in a manger. There was no room for them to stay in the inn. Reader 2: There were some shepherds in that part of the country who were spending the night in the fields, taking care of their flocks. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone over them. They were terribly afraid, but the angel said to them: Reader 3: "Do not be afraid. I am here with good news for you which will bring great joy to all of the people. This very day in David's town, your Savior was born, Christ the Lord! And this is what will prove it to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." The Word of the Lord. All: Thanks be to God. Each family member adds a shepherd, a lamb, and any other animals to the manger.

Leader: Caring God, help us to be open to you in our lives. Slow us down so that we will not miss you when you come. We ask this in the name of Jesus, your Son. All: Amen

On Christmas Eve

Prepare: Place a single white candle in the center of the Advent wreath. Give a candle to each person present and gather at the manger scene. Put out the figure of the Infant Jesus. As you lower the lights, quiet and get ready for prayer. Light all 4 candles of the Advent wreath.

All: Lord, we gather with the people who no longer wait because you have come!

Reader: A reading from the gospel according to Luke: (Luke 2:15-15, 20) Now, when the angels had gone from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened that God made known to us." So they hurried away and found Mary and Joseph and the baby lying in the manger..... And the shepherds returned to their flocks, glorifying and praising God.

Leader: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

At these words, the appointed child places the baby Jesus in the manger. Light each person's candle from one of the Advent candles. Next, all gathered light the single white candle from their candles. Then, extinguish the 4 Advent candles.

Leader: Jesus, we carry your light in our hearts!

All: Amen!


