The Feast of Saint Joseph

Each year the Church celebrates the Feast Day of St. Joseph on March 19th. St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary was declared Patron of the Universal Church in 1870 by Pope Pius IX and Guardian of the Redeemer in 1989 by Saint Pope John Paul II. He is patron of workers and carpenters as well as of Austria, Belgium, Canada, Mexico, Peru, and (south) Vietnam. This year the feast of St. Joseph is moved to Monday, March 20 because of his feast day falling on the fourth Sunday of Lent.

What do we know about St. Joseph?

Pastor's

- His father was Jacob, from the royal family of David.
- He was the foster father of Jesus and the husband of Mary.
- He was a carpenter who lived in Nazareth.
- He never uttered a single, blessed word that was recorded in Scripture.
- He was a man of faith and action: he does what the angel tells him—he takes Mary as his wife, he goes to Bethlehem, he finds a place to stay for the night—even if it is a stable, he takes his family and flees to Egypt, and then returns to Nazareth
- When Jesus was 12 years-old he and Mary took Jesus to be presented to the Temple – customary practice for a devout Jew. That is the last reference or knowledge that we have of Joseph.

Throughout Christian history, there's been a lot of discussion/debate about Joseph's age. Early on, due to concern about making sure it was understood that Mary was a virgin, Joseph was depicted as an old man-the thought being that advanced age safeguarded virtue (in this instance, virginity). Eventually this was debunked by examples from the OT which depict lecherous old men, e.g., Lot falling into sin with his daughters, the elders who accused Susannah. Later on, it was believed that Joseph was a mature but not old man, as he would have had to possess the maturity and experience, together with the physical



or, necessary for his mission as the protector of Mary and Jesus.

The Gospels are silent on this point in one way, but in another their silence indicates that no one thought that anyone other than Joseph was the father of Jesus, so Joseph and Mary must have been a normal looking couple, and together with Jesus, their family must have appeared to be nothing out of the ordinary. Scholars suggest there's good reason to think, given age, marriage, and morbidity patterns of the time, that Mary was about 14 years old and Joseph was perhaps a few years older, say, 18-20, when they married.

During this time of giving, a QCD from your IRA is a great way to give back to the church.

The IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) allows taxpayers 70 ½ or older to donate up to

\$100,000 from their individual retirement accounts (IRAs) directly to charitable nonprofits. When a taxpayer reaches age 72 (old rule 70 ½) they have to withdraw a required minimum distribution (RMD) from their IRA each year, which is taxable income. However, if the taxpayer donates up to \$100,000 of their RMD to a qualified charity, via a QCD, the RMD is not taxable income, which could be more beneficial than getting the charitable deductions for the actual donation. Eucharistic Encounter Weekend




