astor's Corner

Blessings and Woes

During this President's Day weekend, I share a quote from my favorite president, Abraham Lincoln, who one said: "America will never be destroyed from the outside. If we falter and lose our freedoms, it will be because we destroyed ourselves." America is heralded as the land of the free, but for many people who live here, what exactly makes us so free when compared to other countries isn't always appreciated. While many Americans gripe about the limitations put on us by our government, there is actually a wealth of freedoms we enjoy on a daily basis without even realizing it: From what we wear and how we express ourselves, to how we worship, how we vote, to how we parent our kids. As Americans, we are proud to declare: "I can do what I want, it's a free country!" Our Scripture readings today remind us that all choices are not the same. Some bring blessing, some woe.

In our first reading today, Jeremiah was trying to get the leaders of his day to avoid making a big mistake. Israel was beset with enemies. Strong neighbors constantly threatened to annihilate God's people with military force. The leaders of the country sought to solve these threats by making an alliance with a strong protector country. Things haven't changed much since then, have they? So, Jeremiah had a different idea: "Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings." He is a barren bush. "Blessed is the one who trust in the Lord." He is a fruitful tree. The leaders did not listen to Jeremiah, and disaster followed.

In our second reading to the Corinthians, St. Paul wrote enthusiastically about his dream. The Corinthians doubted the resurrection of the body, which did not fit their ideas about body and soul. They may have been experiencing the same misgivings people have felt in every age. Is God a fairly tale? Is religion, "the opiate of the people," as Karl Marx claimed? St. Paul based his message and staked his life on the resurrection of Jesus. Dead people do not come back to life, but it did happen for Jesus. We, too, who believe can share in the resurrection and this, too, can be our hope.

Jesus inaugurated his ministry in the Gospel of Luke with a Sermon on the Plain. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus is on a mountain (place that is closest to God) where he gives us eight great visions of discipleship—the eight Beatitudes. In contrast Luke has Jesus give his message on a level plain, a crossroads, and mingles among the people—apostles—disciples—non-disciples—rich and poor—the sorrowful and the happy. People are coming to him with all kinds of diseases and he stops and says something startling: "Blessed are you who are poor, you who are hungry, you who are weeping, you who experience hatred." Then Jesus says something even more alarming: "Woe to you who are rich, you who are satisfied, you who are joyful, woe to you when people are speaking well of you." All of this is the opposite of what they expected to hear, and what we expect to hear.

So what does this mean? Do we have to believe that anyone who has more than sufficient money, food, who laughs, or who is spoken well of are not going to enter the Kingdom of God? Probably not! What Jesus is getting at is the inner attitudes all of us have within us. The temptation—and it is a temptation for all of us—is to get what we need and forget about others. So, Jesus promotes a different dream. Through these blessings and woes Jesus is teaching us to look at what really nourishes our soul. Do we draw from our selfworth, our reputation, our happiness, our purpose in life from the surface—that which passes, or from that which endures?

Parish Office Closed Monday, February 17, 2025

During this time of giving, a QCD from your IRA is a great way to give back to the church.

The IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) allows taxpayers 70 ½ or older to donate up to \$100,000 from their individual retirement accounts (IRAs) directly to charitable nonprofits. When a taxpayer reaches age 72 (old rule 70 ½) they have to withdraw a required minimum distribution (RMD) from their IRA each year, which is taxable income. However, if the taxpayer donates up to \$100,000 of their RMD to a qualified charity, via a QCD, the RMD is not taxable income, which could be more beneficial than getting the charitable deductions for the actual donation.
