

Pastor's Corner

Every American citizen, of the right age, remembers where they were and what they were doing 20 years ago, on September 11, 2001. I had just finished saying Mass for the grade school children at St. Patrick's Parish, in Dixon, IL. After Mass, the Parish Secretary told me that an airplane had just flew directly into one of the towers of the World Trade Center in New York City. I couldn't believe my ears, so I decided to go over to the rectory and turn on the television. Not long after I turned it on, I actually saw a second plane hit the second tower. At this time, it was clear that this was no freak accident, but that we were under attack. Then I learned of two more planes, one which would hit the Pentagon and a fourth plane that never reached its intended target (the U.S. Capitol Building) due to the heroic actions of a number of passengers aboard that



Flight. At noon today (September 11, 2021) I was blessed to be part of a special "Patriot Day" held at Union Cemetery, here in Crystal Lake. A great feeling of patriotic pride in stirred in my heart, in much the same way it did when I heard the stories of so many heroic Americans who risked and gave their lives for others in one of our nation's greatest tragedies. A similar feeling of pride and admiration filled my heart a few years ago when I had an opportunity to visit the 9/11 Memorial in New York City. The goal of those terrorists was to attack our economic center, our defense center and our political center. They hit 3 of their 4 intended targets, so it was considered a successful day in the eyes of many terrorists. They certainly wounded us. Yet the spirit of our country proved to be quite resilient.

Today, many believe that an even greater threat to our country may be home grown terrorists, who have a great desire to attack the foundations of our country. As a person of faith, one of my most fervent prayers is for greater unity within our country. For me this starts with our Church. We have so many values and teachings that our Church stands for and believes in. If only we became more knowledgeable of these teachings and fully embraced them, I firmly believe that we would be a more united Church. As a united Church we could become a much more powerful and influential force within our country.

Our St. Thomas Fest represents not only an opportunity to come together for family fun, games, local music and good food, but also an opportunity to pray for these fallen heroes of 9/11. An outdoor Stations of the Cross was added to our grounds out by the beautifully maintained Birdie's Garden. We also plan to have a special blessing for this wonderful devotion of our Church.

This weekend, we also are conducting an In-Pew Time & Talent Sign-Up opportunity at all weekend Masses. I would like to make a special plea for our Worship ministries (Liturgy & Music). We need help in almost every category. Our Mass is not only Jesus's most precious gift to us, but his command to "do this in memory of me." (Luke 22: 19) The Second Vatican Council picked up on this and said that the Sacred Liturgy calls for the full and active participation of the entire congregation. We are to be participants, not mere spectators. Our liturgies would be so much more beautiful and life-giving, if we all embraced the command of the Lord and the teaching of the Second Vatican Council.

We need your presence here at our Worship! Please consider your own call to a fuller participation in the Lord's greatest gift to us – the gift of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Yes, we will continue to Live-Stream, but it really is time to come back to Church with your whole body, mind, heart and soul!

The title, Our Lady of Sorrows, given to our Blessed Mother focuses on her intense suffering and grief during the passion and death of our Lord. Traditionally, this suffering was not limited to the passion and death event; rather, it comprised the seven dolours or seven sorrows of Mary, which were foretold by the Priest Simeon who proclaimed to Mary, This child [Jesus] is destined to be the downfall and the rise of many in Israel, a sign that will be opposed and you yourself shall be pierced with a sword so that the thoughts of many hearts may be laid bare (Luke 2:34-35). These seven sorrows of our Blessed Mother included the flight of the Holy Family into Egypt; the loss and finding of the child Jesus in the Temple; Mary's meeting of Jesus on His way to Calvary; Mary's standing at the foot of the cross when our Lord was crucified; her holding of Jesus when He was taken down from the cross; and then our Lord's burial. In all, the prophecy of Simeon that a sword would pierce our Blessed Mother's heart was fulfilled in these events. For this reason, Mary is sometimes depicted with her heart exposed and with seven swords piercing it. More importantly, each new suffering was received with the courage, love, and trust that echoed her fiat, let it be done unto me according to Thy word, first uttered at the Annunciation.


This Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows grew in popularity in the 12th century, although under various titles. Granted, some writings would place its roots in the eleventh century, especially among the Benedictine monks. By the fourteenth and fifteenth centuries, the feast and devotion were widespread throughout the Church.

Therefore, as we honor our Blessed Mother, our Lady of Sorrows, we honor her as the faithful disciple and exemplar of faith. Let us pray as we do in the opening prayer of the Mass for this feast day: Father, as your Son was raised on the cross, His Mother Mary stood by Him, sharing His sufferings. May your Church be united with Christ in His suffering and death and so come to share in His rising to new life. Looking to the example of Mary, may we too unite our sufferings to our Lord, facing them with courage, love, and trust...catholiceducation.org

Y ustedes, ¿quién dicen que soy yo? Es la pregunta que Jesús hizo a sus discípulos en su tiempo histórico, y ahora nos la hace a nosotros. Es una pregunta muy importante que debe ser respondida individualmente. Con ayuda de la fe, se puede dar una respuesta más efectiva. Dicho de otro modo, la verdadera fe incluye un compromiso diario de aventurarse en el misterio de la cruz. Es difícil el camino, pero te lleva a la vida. La reflexión del Papa Francisco es de gran ayuda para adentrar en detalle e iluminar a cada uno en el saber dónde está nuestra respuesta ahora. “Pero el Señor quiere que sus discípulos de ayer y de hoy establezcan con él una relación personal, y así lo acojan en el centro de sus vidas. Por esto los exhorta a ponerse con toda la verdad entre sí mismos y les pregunta. ¿Y ustedes, quién dicen que soy yo? Jesús, hoy, nos vuelve a dirigir esta pregunta tan directa y confidencial a cada uno de nosotros” (9/16/018). Puede ser que contestemos como Pedro, quien, lleno de entusiasmo y quizá sin pensar, da una respuesta inmediata: “Tú eres el Mesías” (Marcos 8:29). Pedro, te has sacado un diez de nota, que buena respuesta has dado. Pero enseguida, te equivocaste al querer decirle lo que debería de hacer con respecto a sus padecimientos en la cruz. El Papa Francisco continúa diciéndonos: “Jesús nos dice que, para seguirle, se necesita negarse a uno mismo, es decir, los pretextos del propio orgullo egoísta, y cargar con la cruz”. Enseguida, el Evangelio nos dice: “¿De qué le sirve a uno si ha ganado el mundo entero, pero se ha destruido a sí mismo?” ©LPi
