From the Pastor's Desk...



The death of a family member or loved friend is always difficult, but for one who professes atheism it must be the saddest event imaginable in life. An atheist is an individual who is convinced there is no God and no future life beyond this one. Therefore, when one dies, they turn to dust in their graves and that is the end of them. They will never experience life again. For an atheist, their belief is that same sad fate awaits them and awaits us all.

Thank God, that our Christian faith gives us a very different perspective. Thank God, that our belief in the Resurrected Christ gives a reason to be a people of faith, hope and love every day of our lives, no matter what the circumstances of our lives may be. Thank God, because of Jesus Christ, we have a firm conviction that death is not the end, but a whole new beginning.

Today's Feast of the Ascension of our Lord is the confirmation and guarantee of this doctrine of our faith. Today we celebrate the Lord's promise of eternal happiness for all his faithful followers.

Yet the certitude that our beloved one has gone to his/her true life and will be there to meet us when our turn comes, is always at the back of our minds to console and comfort us. What all human beings want is to live on forever with our dear ones. Death breaks that continuity but only for a little while. That break is necessary for the new life to begin.

So, let's look up to heaven today in our prayers. Let us picture Christ ascending to his Father and our Father. Then, let us say, "Thank you, God, for creating me, and for giving me, through the Incarnation of your beloved Son, the possibility and the assurance that if I do my part here, when death comes it will not be an enemy, but a friend. Yes, when the time for my own death comes, help me greet it as a friend who is there to guide by path to the supernatural life, which You have, in your love, planned and prepared for me."

I also would like to take a moment to wish all those who will be graduating in the next couple of weeks my sincere congratulations and prayers for you in your time of transition to the next phase of your respective journeys. May you always see that Jesus walks with you on this journey and wants to guide your path. Please never think that you are meant to journey alone. Also, my sincere congratulations and prayers for Fr. Kevin Gregus, who was ordained at Holy Name Cathedral, in Chicago, this weekend, and is celebrating his Mass of Thanksgiving here at St. Thomas the Apostle, this Sunday, May 21, at 2:00 pm.

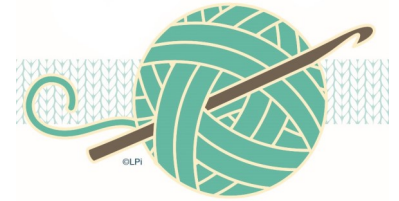

Seeking Christ in One Another

The funeral luncheon, the Irish wake, the vigil at an ailing loved one's bedside: in times of crisis, people gather. In moments of sadness, fear, and confusion, we gravitate toward one another. For some reason, the feelings are so much more bearable when we are not alone.

I'm sure that the disciples and their companions, gathered in the upper room after the Lord's Ascension, did all of the things we typically do at these functions. I'm sure they hugged and talked and shared food, processing together the remarkable events they had witnessed.

But we don't hear about any of that. We hear only that they prayed — fervently, and together.

Saint John Paul II famously said that "it is Jesus that you seek when you dream of happiness; He is waiting for you when nothing else you find satisfies you."

And I think that, whenever we gather, in good times or in bad, we think we are seeking companionship — but we are actually seeking God.

As I think back on the last few crisis-gatherings my family has had, I try to remember when we have stopped everything to pray together. I can think of a few times, but to be honest, they are too few. We are usually occupied with more practical tasks: planning the funeral, talking to the doctor, making the decisions, ordering the food. Just trying to survive through it.

But this is the busywork of sorrow, and it is a waste of our time. We would do better to follow the example of the disciples and remember that, in these dire moments, God is waiting for us.

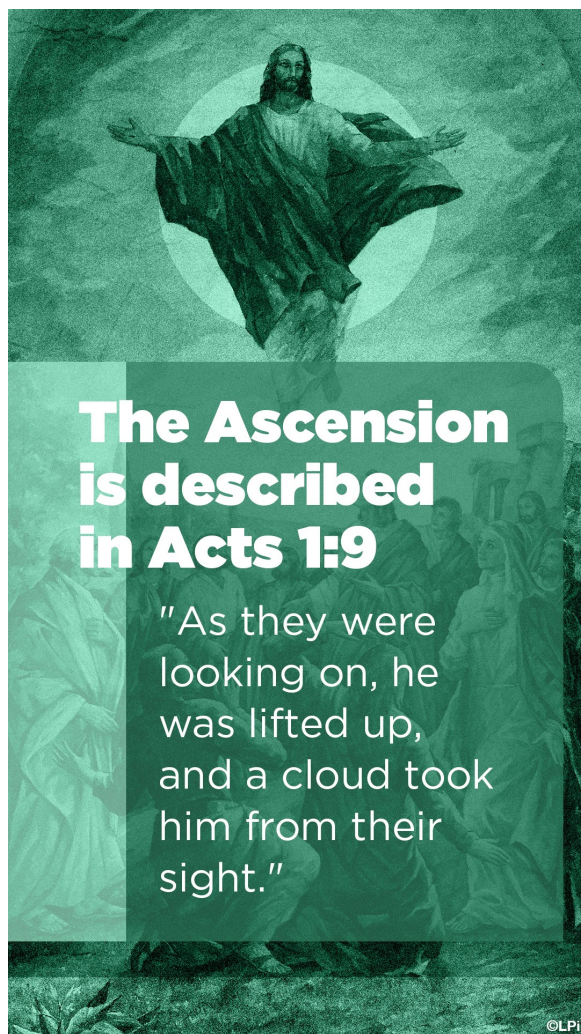
Corpus Christi

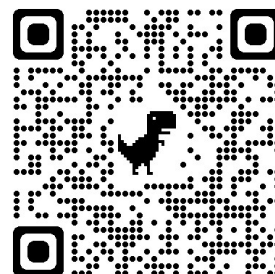

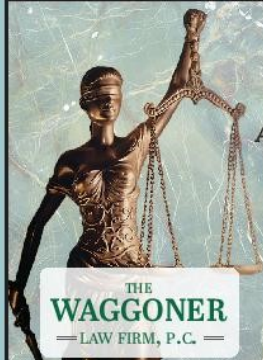
