From the Pastor's Desk...



"This is the last piece of my puzzle, the one where I go home to God." Dick was 97 years old and not far from death. He was explaining to his niece that he saw life as a puzzle. When we are born, we have a box of pieces, each representing a piece of one's life. As we live life, the puzzle fills in, and we see the picture develop. Eventually, there is only one piece left, the one that takes us home to God.

This image looks a bit like our Scriptures today. Exodus launches the beginning of the journey into the desert where Moses encounters God on the mountain and invites the people into a covenant with the Divine Self. God made a promise to the people of Israel. If they adhere to the covenant, they will be protected.

Just as in putting together a jigsaw puzzle, a person starts with the border and then fills in the rest of the design, so the covenant is the structure that gives boundaries to their lives. If they keep the rules of the covenant, then their lives will have order and safety. Without the border, the picture falls into chaos. Each person has the puzzle of their own life with the goal of seeing how that picture fits into God's universal picture.

God calls us and we are expected to positively respond. God called the world into being, called Moses into leadership, and called the people into covenant. All said "yes". If we follow God's way, we become God's favored possessions. In the psalms we hear that God has made us, and we are God's. If we are obedient to God's calling, then our lives will be held together in harmony, just as a border holds the puzzle together. If we live out God's ideal picture, then Jesus' mission will be complete. So, we must all ask ourselves; How do I live out my life as God's favored son or daughter?

Because Jesus knew he could not complete his work by himself, he sent apostles to do what he did: heal the sick and cast out evil. When we are baptized, we are sent out on that same mission, the one given to Jesus, to help set the world in balance and harmony. The ultimate finished puzzle is the kingdom of God. According to Jesus, that is already among us in followers who live in love and service.

As we gather at the Lord's table, we reflect on how our lives are being lived according to the call we have received. As we say "Amen" at Mass today, think of what that will demand of us this week.

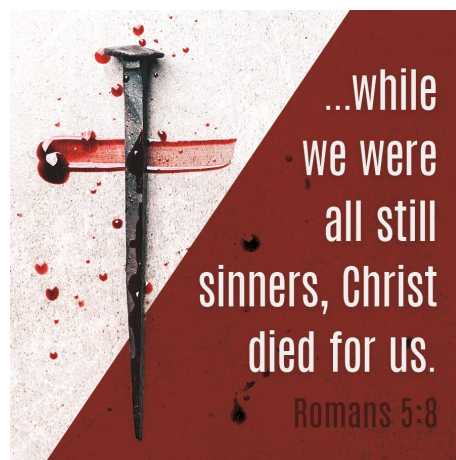

Our Lady of Perpetual Help June 27th

According to legend, the image of Our Lady of Perpetual Help was painted sometime in the 13th century and is a copy of the painting by the gospel writer, St. Luke. It is an icon painted on wood and in the Eastern world religious art is meant to show God's presence in creation. This image is considered the most well-known religious icon and indeed, it helps to connect us directly to God.



Viewing the icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, we see the child, Jesus previewing his role in Redemption. In his anguish, he perhaps, ran to his mother Mary so quickly that his sandal is undone. The cause of his concern can be seen to the right and left of Our Lady. On her right, we see the Archangel Gabriel holding a cross and four nails and to the left, we see St. Michael holding a lance, a vessel with vinegar and a pole with a sponge.

Mary is holding and comforting Jesus while at the same time presenting him to us. The star centered on her veil symbolizes Mary's guiding role in our plan of salvation. She is gazing out at us, her children here on earth as she offers us constant hope and comfort.

This famous icon was acquired or stolen by a merchant as he left the island of Crete. He had it shipped to Rome in the 15th century. At sea, the ship encountered a furious storm. The passenger and crew, in fear for their lives, prayed to Our Lady and all were saved.

The merchant kept the icon in his home until he was dying, when he subsequently ordered the family to move it for public viewing and veneration. A young girl in the family was instructed in a dream from Our Lady to display it in the Church of St. Matthew. For the next 300 years, the image was displayed in the church where miracles and special graces were given to the pilgrims who visited the site.

The church was destroyed during the Napoleonic Wars but the icon was kept safe and moved to an obscure chapel. It was rediscovered by a young man who was a Redemptorist priest. In 1866, Blessed Pope Pius IX was reminded that he had prayed at St. Matthew's before the sacred image and decided to entrust it to the safekeeping Redemptorists. He declared that the Redemptorists make the image

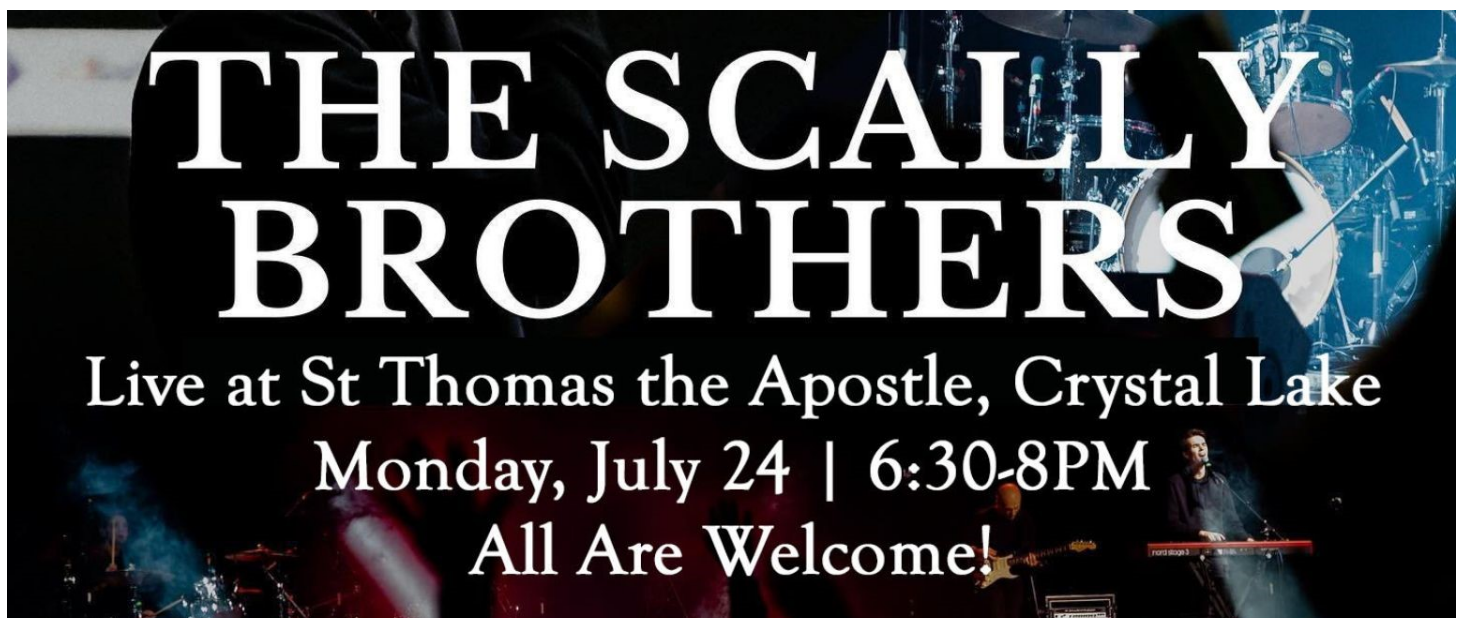

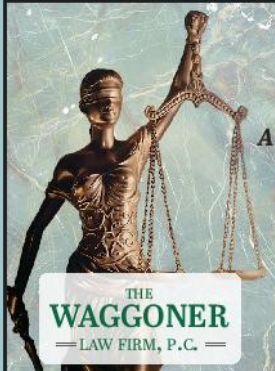
