From the Pastor's Desk...



On the Feast Day of Corpus Christi, Sunday, June 11, 2023, our parish kicked off our year of Eucharistic Revival with a Bi-lingual Mass followed by an outdoor Eucharistic Procession. Our Hispanic Community is following this up with a Gran Kermas Festival on Sunday, July 30. The festivities will begin with an outdoor Mass, at 10:00 am, on our Lake Street grounds.

The parish theme of our year of revival is "Christ Among Us", for Christ is surely always among us, and nowhere is that more true than His Real Presence in the Eucharist. Starting in September, we will have monthly opportunities that will center around various Spoken Presentations, Eucharistic Encounters, Holy Hours, and other offerings. June 11 – A Eucharistic Encounter Evening followed by a Communal Dinner.

July 17-21 – National Eucharistic Conference in Indianapolis, Indiana

Although all the details of this tentative agenda are not firmly in place, I wanted to share with you some of the ideas that we have been working on. I would also love to see some small group activity centered on our Central Sacrament. Many of you have told me how much you have benefitted from Brant Pitre's book, *Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist*. This might be an excellent book for our St. Thomas Book Club and our other small groups to explore in the coming year.

My friends Christ is among us always, but most especially in the Eucharist. Let's intentionally all set aside some time in the year ahead to celebrate this most important gift of our faith that the Lord first gave us at the Last Supper, and continues to share with us in every celebration of the Mass. Please do give some serious thought to being part of some or all of the above offerings. More information will follow as each of the above evenings come closer.

Why do priests wear a Roman collar?

The practice of priests wearing the Roman collar developed in the mid-nineteenth century as an alternative to wearing the cassock which in some places was seen as impractical or which was even outlawed by anti-Catholic legislation. Since its introduction, it has taken different forms, and if you visit different countries to-day, you will see variation in what priests wear.



The Code of Canon Law simply observes that priests wear “suitable ecclesiastical garb” according to the judgments of the national bishops conferences and local custom (no. 284). The US Bishops have instructed that outside of liturgical functions, a “black suit and Roman collar are the usual formal attire for priests. The use of the cassock is at the discretion of the cleric.” Priests who are members of religious communities are to follow the rules of their institute regarding the habit or other approved clothing.

In the end, whether a priest wears the Roman collar, a religious habit, or, as is the case in many European countries, a suit and tie (to distinguish them from Protestant clergy who wear a collar) the goal of their clerical clothing is to serve as a sign of their commitment to guide and to serve, and to also allow them to be truly public figures because they are ordained for the service of all.

Why do priests kiss the altar at the start of Mass?

Our churches and chapels are filled with symbols. We might think of the more common symbols (like the crucifix, statues, stained-glass windows, vestment color and altar cloths) as well as major symbols (such as the paschal candle and the baptismal font). But there are some things that we can take for granted in our sacred spaces, because unfortunately, they seem to just be part of the building, including three of the main symbols of our liturgy: the ambo (lectern), the chair for the priest celebrant, and the altar.

These three objects are placed in a specially designated area called the sanctuary. They are the places where the Word of God is proclaimed, where the priest prays and presides at the celebration, and where the bread and wine are offered by the priest during the Eucharistic Prayer. Although each of these objects is sacred because of the role they play in our worship, the altar holds a special place. In a document containing the rules and instructions for the Mass — the “General Instruction of the Roman Missal” — we read: “The altar on which the Sacrifice of the Cross is made present under sacramental signs is also the table of the Lord to which the People of God is called together to participate in the Mass, as well as the center of the thanksgiving that is accomplished throughout the Eucharist” (no. 296).

One of the ways that we recognize the importance of the altar is when the priest and deacon kiss the altar at the beginning of Mass. Kissing is an ancient act of devotion. Remember, we also kiss the cross on Good Friday, and the deacon or priest kisses the “Book of the Gospels” after the Gospel is proclaimed. This act of devotion reminds us that the altar is a symbol of Jesus, the “living stone” (see 1 Peter 2:4), the foundation stone of our faith. It is a symbol gesture, but it is a powerful reminder of the One on whom our faith is built and in whose name we gather as the “household of faith” (see Galatians 6:10).

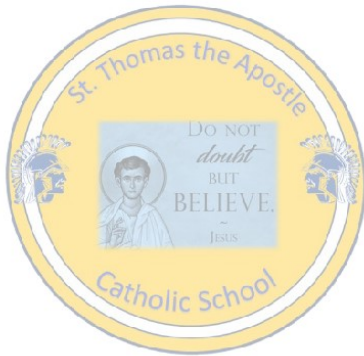

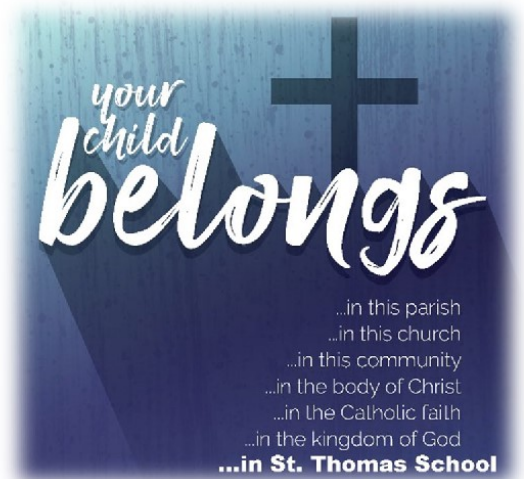

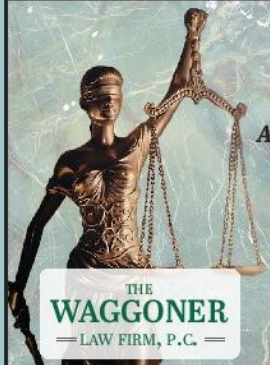
