## From the Pastor's Desk...



The best way to ruin your morning is to listen to the morning news. Every morning we turn on our media and hear a barrage of bad news. The world is ablaze with violence: natural disasters, warring nations, murder, neighborhood gangs, drugs, and illness. Before we begin our daily work, we are brought down by all this horror.

Has it ever been a peaceful world in which humankind exists in humility and mutual love? Quite simply: no. A good understanding of history will confirm this answer. Also, we always need to balance all the bad news through the lens of the Gospels, which, of course, is the Good News. Jesus gives us insight in how we can live in peace.

Today's readings lead us to consider what we are to do with the violence that pervades our world. We cannot sit idly by and ignore injustice. The words of Christ offer a clear challenge to every peacemaker.

We certainly should feel pain at the horrible suffering in the world. Whether we just read or see it in the news or have experienced it firsthand, we certainly can grasp our inhumanity to each other. We are left with a hunger for justice. How do we begin? Violence is never justified, yet we learn much from the circumstances that have ignited a conflict.

God summons Ezekiel to be a prophet to speak for him, to try to change the behavior of the people. God always remains faithful to his promise. He never gives up and yearns for his people to be obedient. He has that same yearning for us.

The Gospel advises us to be patient with those who have sinned. Jesus encourages his disciples to be helpful with our brothers and sisters. We are to work things out, heart to heart. Jesus asks that we give others the benefit of the doubt. This advice still holds weight in our disagreements. We are to keep trying to reach out with understanding. Go first to the person himself or herself. If hearts remain hard and stubborn, Jesus says take two others, don't give up, but rather offer compassion and mercy. Finally, when all else fails, it is time to go to the larger community. Only after all this effort at reconciliation falls short, do we walk away, believing that we have done the most we can do.

We are not in this effort alone. Jesus assures us at the end of the Gospel that whenever we are gathered together in prayer, he is with us. We need to use prayer as our greatest weapon against hatred and division. As we approach the table of the Lord, let us leave our divisions at the feet of the bread of life. May the Sacred Presence renew our desire to live in peace.



## Pax et Bonum (Peace and Goodness to You), Friends,

The life of a priest and the life of a religious, be it a monk or friar for men, or be it a nun or sister for women, is an extra-ordinary life to lead; and it is extraordinary because it is a supernatural calling by the Lord Himself to follow Him in a radical way, with an undivided heart. Because this is so, every unmarried Christian man and woman should make the time and should find the silence to pray, that is to listen, to see if the gentle voice of the Lord is calling them to this radical witness, this radical self-gift. But unfortunately, we live in a culture and in a time that too easily chokes the silence out of our lives, and leaves us wandering through a life of noise and chaos and uncertainty. In this environment, it is nearly impossible for our youth to even entertain the possibility that the Lord could be calling them to this kind of extra-ordinary life. For this reason, we must do all we can to provide our youth with that time and silence, to provide them with a reminder to listen to the Lord, to provide them with the encouragement of our Lord, to be not afraid.

It is in this light that the St. Thomas Vocations Wall (at the Oak Street location, South entrance, outside of the sacristy) has come to be. This presentation displays the portraits of all the young men and women, from this great parish, that have made the time and have found the silence and did hear and respond to God's gentle voice calling them to *follow* Him in a radical way. And on that wall, you will see two religious sisters and several priests, one of them a bishop, all from St. Thomas Parish. Under each of their portraits, you will find their individual prayer cards with their names (some of those prayer cards are still to come), pray for them.

Also, you will see that there are also several empty portraits up on that wall, and this is for a reason. And so now I turn and address the unmarried young men and young women of this parish, especially the altar servers: I invite you to take a moment and imagine your portrait up on that wall, imagine yourself taking the hand of our Lord and following Him in a radical way. Young men, I want you to imagine yourself living an adventurous life as the Lord's priest or living the silent and mystic life of God's monk or friar. Young

women, I want you to imagine yourself living a rose-filled life as the Lord's bride, whether as a nun or a religious sister. After doing this, I invite you to go into the adoration chapel and sit in silence and listen. Make the chapel your home away from home, and use the vocational pamphlets/booklets if they help, but make the time and find the silence.

I turn back now to the parish as a whole. Your love for the Lord is great and the many vocations from this parish is a great testament to that love. But let your love continue to grow for only then will you be able to place more of your trust in Him. May the Lord keep you and bless you now and always.




