From the Pastor's Desk...



If you were to come up with one word that forms a continuance and common ground between last week and this Sunday, it would be the word: compensation. The lack of forgiveness illustrated last week asks for reparation (a form of justice) and separates itself from mercy. In today's Gospel, laborers grumble about having to receive wages, which they assess as not in accord with their work and seek reimbursement (yet another version of justice). So, the parable illustrating God's generosity might be seen as another version of mercy, which endlessly forgives without cost. In both stories, the image of God calls us to think very deeply about divine excess or that we cannot really fathom the depth of the Lord's forgiveness and generosity.

Today's parable is one that often confounds people, because it messes with our sense of justice. The story of the vineyard workers and the wages paid for their work is disturbing in some ways. Most of us in that situation can identify with the workers who started at dawn and feel they deserve more than the workers who began an hour before the day's end.

But God's ways are not ours, nor His thoughts our thoughts. While we are made in the image and likeness of God, we are not God. For that we can all be grateful! We can all be grateful that there is One who knows more, sees more, and understands more than our humanness allows. In the perfection of God's plan, we all share equally. But one look around at our world today shows us that there are wide disparities between those who have and those who do not.

Would any one of us be as generous as the vineyard owner in compensating those who did not work for us? It's hard to imagine that we would. And yet this attitude is at the heart of equity for the poor and disenfranchised.

Our is a God of mercy and forgiveness, generous in every way and abundant in gifts showered on us. As we enter into this celebration of the eucharistic meal, let us do so with grateful hearts for all God has done in our lives.

It is my sincere hope that you will be present for Fr. Linkenheld's presentation on the Eucharist this Tuesday, September 26, at 7:00 pm, at our Oak Street Church. This will be the first of many monthly offerings that will be held at St. Thomas the Apostle over the next ten months. Come and be part of the National Eucharistic Revival!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It has been so great settling in and meeting so many of you the past couple months; thank you so much, sincerely, for welcoming me into the parish as readily as you have. As has been announced at Mass, I wish to invite each of you to the opening event of our parish's year-long Eucharistic Revival. I will be giving a talk at the Oak St. church on Tuesday, September 26, starting at 7:00 PM. Here's a little something about the event and what to expect for WHEN you come!

Primarily, this is a kick-off event. We have a lot of amazing opportunities planned for the year that will be offered monthly to revive our parish community by re-centering us on the Presence of Christ-amongus in the Holy Eucharist. This event is an introduction to a year-long journey of faith we think the Lord is calling all of us to make and that we hope to make with all of you.

Around 8:00 PM, I will be available for some Q&A time, to answer any questions that come up throughout the evening from the talk or table discussion. We'll close the night with a prayer and blessing.


I understand it is a "school night" but I want to encourage and invite families to come, because the Lord desires to renew, reach, and give life to our whole parish community, not just the adults. On that note, I also encourage each of you to be a missionary and invite someone who hasn't been to Mass in a while, or might be a little out-of-practice in how they live the faith, to come to this event; the Lord isn't done with any of us yet.

I truly believe that the events planned monthly for this year, beginning with this talk and fellowship-discussion, can be opportunities for Jesus to enter into our lives in a new and powerful way. "The Lord delights in His people" (Ps 149:4), in you and me, and desires us to live full lives, to have a lived experience abundant with meaning. It's possible for us by living a dialogue with Him, the Answer to our hearts, tangibly present among us in the Eucharist; that dialogue is what He is re-proposing to us and inviting us back into this year, starting the evening of Tuesday, September 26. I hope to see you there!





October is the month of the Rosary

The rosary is a powerful prayer and the favorite prayer of Our Blessed Mother. On October 7th, we celebrate Mary under her title as "Our Lady of the Rosary".

In the 16th century, the Papal States, Genoa and Spain formed an alliance called "The Holy League" to prevent the Turkish Ottoman Empire from advancing to the West. Already successful at conquering the Byzantine Empire, the Ottomans ruled Christians there under their version of Islamic law. The Christian fleet was comprised of over 200 ships and it sailed towards Greece to confront their aggressors. Under the direction of Pope Pius V, Christians gathered in their churches to pray the rosary along with the soldier sailors of the fleet. Outnumbered by the Turks, the Christian sailors invoked the intercession of Mary and she led them to victory in the famous Battle of Lepanto.

Please join us in celebrating Mary under her title of Our Lady of the Rosary. At the Marian October Table, you will see Mary as we honor her under 10 different titles. Rosaries and holy cards will be available for you at this table at the back of the church.

Our parish will be joining over 20,000 rosary rallies around the country for the America Needs Fatima Rosary on Saturday, October 14th from noon-1:30pm outside (rain or shine) at Oak St. Church. Please join us as we pray for Mary's intercession to save America and for the salvation of souls.




