

From the Pastor's Desk...



In the midst of life's challenges, there are always many things to be grateful for. I am very grateful for our Hispanic Community and the wonderful Gran Kermas they had this summer, which raised \$50,000 to go toward the Pierson Street church's facelift (tuckpointing and restoration). We will look forward to having a special celebration at our Pierson Street Church next year, as we will be celebrating its' 100th anniversary! I am also very grateful for our parish school's recent Oktoberfest, which raised \$50,000 to go directly to tuition assistance for those who very much need this help. What a great job by our Alumni Committee and all who assisted in that great fund raiser! And I am grateful to Fr. James Linkenheld for being the presenter at our Eucharistic Revival Kickoff event this past Tuesday, September 26. I am also grateful to all who attended

the event. Thank you!

Fr. Linkenheld did a good job explaining the reason the bishops of our country decided to embark on this revival. They realize that only 31% of Catholics say they believe that the Eucharist is the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. For so many to profess non-belief in a core and central teaching of our faith is a true tragedy. Clearly, somewhere the Church has had a massive failure in our evangelization and our catechesis.

Then Fr. Linkenheld got to the what he believes is the heart of the matter. Each one of us must ask ourselves; "What am I looking for?" That was a question that Jesus asked. For those who were intrigued by what Jesus had to offer, as a great many were (and still are) Jesus said; "Come and see!" or basically, "Come, follow me."

So, we all must ask ourselves these questions; "What am I looking for?" "What does my heart desire?" "What are the standards that I want to live my life by?" "Where is the One who can satisfy my hearts deepest desire?" As Catholics, we have always believed that Jesus is the answer, and that he gives himself to us more than just spiritually, but also physically in the Eucharist. We believe this because Jesus was extremely clear about this in the Gospels. Jesus greatest desire is for us to consume Him in the Eucharist, so our lives will be consumed by Him.

So, once again I thank all who were in attendance and encourage more to come to our next Evening of Adoration and Praise, on Tuesday, October 17, at 7:00 pm. I encourage you to answer the call of Jesus to "Come and See"!

I am also extremely grateful for the individuals who have founded a St. Vincent DePaul Society to take care of the neighbors in need within our parish boundaries. They have done some very fine work in just a little over a half a year of their founding and have helped a great many people. Your prayerful and financial support of this ministry are both very much needed and appreciated!

Finally, I would like to remind you of two very important opportunities coming to our parish; this Tuesday, October 10, at 6:30 pm, Mary Fuller will be offering a presentation on Mental Health and the Art of Accompaniment; then next Saturday, October 14, we will be offering a Domestic Abuse Workshop from 9 am to 3:30 pm, in the Community Room. This will be for anyone interested in learning more about this troubling problem in our society, and to know there are pathways out of the abuse.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Our kick-off event launching the St. Thomas Eucharistic Revival was a fantastic evening, filled with hope and excitement for what the Lord wants to do in our community this year. Many thanks to the generosity and humble service of those who helped make it happen, especially Pat Haviland, our director of evangelization, the Knights of Columbus, who provided the refreshments, as well as those who gave their evening to help provide childcare for those families wanting to participate in the evening. It was overall an exciting success... but just the beginning.

The next monthly event, our first "Upper Room", will be an opportunity for us as a community to sit at the feet of the Master and reflect the question proposed to us at the kick-off event for this year: is Jesus Christ present to my daily life, is faith in Him capable of sustaining my daily, real life experiences – and how does the reality of the Eucharist play into that? Christ gives us a positive proposal to be able to stand in front of this question by inviting us to "come and see". On October 17, at 7 PM in the Oak St. church, we will have an opportunity to do just that. This "Upper Room" event for us will be the same as it was for the apostles in the Upper Room 2000 years ago – a space to encounter a Presence, the deep, intimate love Christ has for each of us and for our parish, found in His gaze upon us. The evening will be a night of Adoration, with a couple of preached reflections in the beginning to frame the night, then I will process with the monstrance throughout the church while praise and worship music is played by The Way. Through these gestures, Christ, truly present among us in the Eucharist, will come in front of our eyes to turn His life-changing divine gaze upon us.




