

## From the Pastor's Desk...



The aggressive prosecuting attorney in a homicide case was grilling the defendant mercilessly. Suddenly deviating from his line of questioning, he turned toward the witness and snapped, "Do you remember where you hid the murder weapon?" The hapless defendant blurted out, "No." He then stammered, "I mean, I didn't even hide the murder weapon," and finally found the wherewithal to say, "I mean, I never had the murder weapon." The prosecutor knew by the jurors' glances at each other that he had sown doubts in their minds about the defendant's innocence. His question had thoroughly discredited the poor fellow on the witness stand.

The lawyer's tactic is a perfect example of what we call a "loaded question" or "begging the question," asking something that contains a false assumption or subtly imputes guilt; its sole purpose is to trap the person who is being interrogated. For example, if someone asks, "Have you finally stopped cheating on your taxes?', you would be in trouble whether you answered "yes" or "no".

In today's Gospel, Jesus is hit with a loaded question designed to trap him. There appears, at least initially, to be no good answer. Jesus avoids the trap by posing questions of his own that turn the tables on his hostile interrogators. They are silenced by the subtle, devastating theological challenge in Jesus' response.

Jesus does not directly engage the political question about refusing to pay the tax as a way of protesting Roman occupation. Jesus recognizes that falling into this trap could lead to his arrest on charges of insurrection or sedition. By allowing Caesar "his due", Jesus opposes both Zealots and Pharisees by acknowledging – even accepting – the practical reality of the Roman tax.

Jesus does not, however, wholeheartedly endorse the position held by the Herodians who question him. The dynasty of the Herods (there were three first-century rulers by that name) survived, even flourished, by appeasing and currying favor with Rome. The Herodians acceptance of the coins with Caesar's image rankled the Zealots and the Pharisees. When Jesus recognizes that the Herodians are "trying to have it both ways," he exposes their hypocrisy. Jesus is not offering, in his reference to the two "renderings", a kind of 50/50 proposition between God and Caesar. Jesus doesn't specify exactly "what belongs to Caesar". He will let others figure that out. Civil society, with its political machinery, may make legitimate demands on us and provide necessary services made possible by our tax dollars. As for the question of what belongs to God (from whom, we believe, every good gift flows), one suspects that Jesus' answer would be simple and unequivocal: *everything*. Shouldn't that determine what we render back?

In our weekly celebration of the Eucharist, we are meant to offer our great prayer of thanksgiving. All that we have and all that we offer are to be gratefully rendered back to God, who is our source and our sustenance. We thank and praise God to whom we owe everything.

#### St. Thomas Mental Health Ministry


