

## From the Pastor's Desk...



Many years ago, Sally Fields starred in the movie "Places in the Heart". It was a powerful story of love of neighbor in which mutual need broke down the barriers between a poor white widow with two children and two men, one black and the other blind. Within it was another story, a terrible story of rejection and racism. In one particularly vicious scene, Moses, who had helped the widowed Sara, was attacked and beaten by the Ku Klux Klan. The Klan was determined to intimidate this undesirable black man and drive him away. Only the intervention of his blind friend saved Moses from a worse fate. All in the story were religious people. Clearly, not all loved their neighbor as themselves.

Today's Gospel has similarities to the storyline of "Places in the Heart". The time and place are different. The characters have changed. We have Jesus, an itinerant teacher, and the Pharisees and Sadducees, upright religious leaders. There is no physical violence. Rather, the leaders conspire to trip Jesus up on a question of God's law so that they might publicly disgrace him and thus rid themselves of this undesirable man (in their eyes). Here too, all in the story were religious people - Jesus, the Pharisees, and the Sadducees. However, clearly not all were imbued with the spirit of the Law which they discussed.

What is the greatest commandment of the Law? In other words, what is absolutely essential, what is the most important standard to live by? Jesus' answer is disconcertingly direct. You shall love the Lord, your God, with everything in you. You shall love your neighbor as yourself. What Jesus tells us is that the greatest commandment has two parts, both on an equal footing. He says in effect that no one can love God and hate his neighbor.

To make sure we don't interpret Jesus' message with too narrow a vision of who that neighbor might be, the Church places before us the reading from Exodus. In the Hebrew Scriptures and in the Gospel the neighbor who has a special claim on believers is the one who lacks resources. Who are those who are not to be oppressed or ignored, but rather to be treated with dignity and justice? The word of God in Exodus is that they are the poor who lack material goods; aliens who are strangers in a foreign land; widows and orphans who have no means of support.

In today's stress-filled, competitive, production-oriented society, it is sometimes a real challenge to even love ourselves. The entire advertising industry conspires to tell us that we are not loveable unless we have the right product to make us handsome/beautiful, and own the car that turns heads, and purchase the latest, the smartest, the best of everything. This can make it hard to discover and respect our own real deeper human needs. Our deepest needs are for understanding, friendship, for support in our efforts as well as for basic material necessities.

Today's Gospel story is interesting if we hear it as a battle of wits between Jesus and religious leaders of his time. It is gripping, if we hear it addressed to us. It implies that whatever we do to promote the quality of life of others on the human, cultural, educational or spiritual level binds us more closely to God and to one another. That is our Christian vocation in this world.






