

## From the Pastor's Desk...



For the entire month of October, bishops and lay delegates from around the world have gathered at the Vatican to participate in the Synod on Synodality. Pope Francis has asked that the participants refrain from disclosing what has been discussed, but Bishop Robert Barron has shared what a typical day at the Synod is like. I thought it would be interesting to share that with you in this bulletin column.

He resides with most of the other American delegates, at the North American College, situated on the Janiculum Hill, about a fifteen-minute walk from St. Peter's. They commence with a quiet Mass in a small chapel at 7 am, and then after a quick breakfast, make their way by bus to the Paul VI audience hall, where the synod has been taking place. They have cleared out the first fifty or so rows of chairs to open a space for thir-

ty-six round tables at which the delegates are seated. The leadership of the synod, including the pope himself (when he is able to attend), are situated at a round table on a slightly elevated platform at the front of the room.

The synodal day begins with prayer (in either Italian, Spanish, English, or French) and proceeds with a calling of the roll and an introduction to that day's work by Cardinal Grech, the General Secretary of the Synod. The focus of their attention was the so-called *Instrumentum Laboris* (working document), which represents a distillation of two years of preparatory conversations around the world. In smaller groups, consideration is given to the various sections of the *Instrumentum* under the guidance of a facilitator, who tightly manages the process. Each person around the table is expected to offer a prepared five-minute contribution, and then, in a second round of discussion, each can react to what the others have said. At the conclusion of this lengthy undertaking, the group puts together a three-minute summary of the main points of convergence and divergence. Then, one by one, each group shares these summaries with the plenary assembly. When those reports are finished, all the delegates are permitted to request time for what are called "free interventions."

Although the whole process can be rather tiresome, Bishop Barron found the time spent in the small groups the most enjoyable. It enabled people to get to know others from an astonishing variety of backgrounds. In the four groups in which he has so far participated, he has met bishops from Liberia, Hong Kong, the Philippines, Turkey, Germany, and Lithuania, as well as lay delegates from Australia, Canada, Ireland, and Lebanon. Most significantly Bishop Barron remarked, "I just don't think there is any other organization in the world that could gather a group of such stunning cultural and geographical diversity. Being part of these groups shows that Jesus' command to go out to the ends of the world proclaiming the Gospel has been, against all odds and expectations, obeyed."

Bishop Barren describes the overall mood of the synod as businesslike and serene. Important and controversial matters are being discussed, and it is very clear that not everyone is of the same opinion, but he has not heard one raised voice or polemical tone. Very occasionally, following an intervention, a smattering of applause might be heard, but typically, each speech is met with respectful silence. It is a great deal of work and often proves to be very tiring, but also quite fascinating, at times even exhilarating. In one year from now, they will all go back for round two. Please keep all the synodal participants in prayer, that the Holy Spirt may indeed accomplish a great work in and through them.

## Sin on the Soul

Why do some sacraments leave a character or mark on the soul? Don't all sacraments affect the soul?

All sacraments mediate grace and connect us to Christ and to the Church. Some sustain us in our faith journey, while others help us heal from the effects of sin. Each one offers a share in God's life, giving us what we need to be faithful followers of Jesus. But some sacraments change us in ways that are irreversible. The three sacraments that leave a character are Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders. We are literally different people because of the effect of the grace of those sacraments. We are changed at the core of our being in such a fundamental way that we can not go back to what we once were.

In Baptism, we are freed from original sin, initiated into the Body of Christ as adopted sons and daughters. In Confirmation, we are given the fullness of God's Spirit, sealed in his grace and gifted with what we need to live a Christian life. In Holy Orders, a priest is marked as an 'alter Christus,' another Christ, and is once and forever a priest who offers sacrifice, forgives sin, and acts in the person of Christ. In these three sacraments, we are conformed more closely to Christ, reflecting his love and truth.




