

# From the Pastor's Desk...



In our brief two paragraph selection today from John's Gospel, we have the words "look" and "see" six times. "Seeing" is important throughout John's Gospel. But he does not always mean the same thing when he uses that word and neither do we. Let's "look" at three possible meanings of "see" and then make some connections to the journey of faith.

Two people can be watching the same baseball game, and yet two different types of "seeing" may be happening. A casual fan or mere spectator might see the fielders, the batter, the runners on base, and someone warming up in the bullpen. However, when looking at exactly the same scene an avid fan may see a double steal possibility

with runners on first and third. Or, that fan may see a possible squeeze play, because the hitter on deck is lefthanded and the pitcher warming up is a lefty, so the team at bat wants to get a run in any way they can to avoid having their lefty hitter face the lefty in the bullpen. The avid fan may also notice the right fielder playing shallow, which means there will be a play at third if the runner on first tries to score on a single. Two people are viewing the exact same game but in entirely different ways.

Now let's turn to today's Gospel. The two disciples of John see Jesus, but respond in a rather impersonal way. "Where do you live?" They have Jesus in front of them and all they want to know is his address. It is like looking at a baseball game in which the bases are loaded and the score tied and saying "Where does the third basemen live in the off-season?" John, however, sees it in an entirely different way. He "stares hard" at Jesus and sees who Jesus really is: "Look, there is the Lamb of God." He gives a title to Jesus which shows that John sees not only a man before him, but the meaning of that man.

Reality can be that way for us. We can just see what goes on around us: the laughing, the crying, the loving, the dying and on and on. Or we can see what it all points to. We can see God at work, not in a far-off place, but right here among us. Elizabeth Barrett Browning gives us an example of this second type of seeing:

Earth's crammed with heaven,
And every common bush afire with God;
But only he who sees, takes off his shoes...

Jesus can take our superficial sight and bring us further than we ever intended to go. We all need a companion for a journey in darkness, and our faith gives us that companion in Christ. Looking at Jesus, on the deepest level means union with Him. Jesus is the Way, the Truth, and the Light that we need to truly see. Jesus is our door to the Sacred. No matter what kind of seeing we are doing now, we have a God who is beckoning, calling us to look so deep that we can exchange glances of love with the Lord.



# **Christ Is Anything but Ordinary**

We're about to dive headlong into week two of Ordinary Time, and we need to admit, after the hustle and bustle of the holidays, things are indeed looking more ... ordinary, at least in our spiritual lives.

The transcendent highs of the Christmas season are flatlining a bit and the vivid imagery of the Nativity scene has faded. The solemn anticipation of the Advent season is by now a distant memory.

Are you bored yet? Here's a secret: I think that Ordinary Time can actually be quite extraordinary, if we're really living out our baptismal call.

In today's Gospel, Jesus point-blank asks Andrew, who is following him after hearing John the Baptist's testimony: "What are you looking for?" He's asking us the same question.

What are you looking for? Why are you following me? Is it for the Christmas cookies and the Advent carols? Is it for the King's Cake on the Epiphany? Is it for the feeling we get on Christmas when we just know God has done a wondrous thing?

None of those things are bad, but they are not what Andrew was looking for, and they were not what Christ promised him when he said, "Come, and you will see."
