

From the Pastor's Desk...



The Diocese of Rockford is prayerfully considering a potential \$60 million steward-ship initiative. A feasibility study has just begun that will guide any plan of action before moving forward with this initiative. They have engaged CCS Fundraising, a non-profit consulting firm with over 75 years of experience in the Church, to guide this effort. Through this feasibility study, dialogue and input will be sought (from clergy and lay leaders throughout the diocese) on furthering the priorities of our diocese through a possible capital campaign. The goal of this possible campaign is to meet current and future needs of our diocese, including the following:

Ensure the Vitality of our Parishes
Support and Serve our Communities and Families
Strengthen Catholic Education and Evangelization

Each parish has individual needs, which may range from maintenance and capital improvement projects to investment in parish-level programs. 30% of all funds raised in this stewardship initiative will be allocated to local parish needs as determined by each individual parish, with the potential for a more generous over-goal share.

Here at St. Thomas the Apostle, we have been in the process of identifying many of these needs. Last Summer, we hired and are currently working with Chris Mominey of Avanti Advisors to assist in forming a new direction for our school, with an eye on enhancing Communications, Marketing and Enrollment efforts. We are confident that our enrollment will increase in the future based on the spiritual love and support we have witnessed from past and current school families. Our last "Oktoberfest" event was a rousing success raising over \$40,000 for the school! We are now looking forward to our upcoming Open House on January 28, and School Winter Fundraiser on February 10, (at the Vixen, in McHenry).

We also have been attending to many capital projects that have simply needed to be addressed at the present time (parking lots, school boilers, replacing old and ineffective plumbing, updating lighting, tuckpointing, etc.). In addition, we have been developing a five-year plan to look at future projects and related expenses. The past few months have been devoted to securing estimates for many of these projects. Our current income and savings simply will not support all the work that needs to be accomplished. So, the proposed Diocesan Stewardship Initiative is something that promises to greatly benefit our parish as well as our diocese.

As we begin our parish's second century, we find ourselves in a time of Eucharistic Revival. We have the Real Presence of Christ to offer us transformation, hope and new life. We do face some real challenges, but we certainly are not the first generation of St. Thomas families to face challenges. Our ancestors have lived through two world wars, a great depression, and a host of other very significant challenges. Their faith in the Real Presence of Christ was a major factor in them meeting those many challenges and will be for us as well.



St. Marianne Cope | January 23

Barbara Koop, later Mother Marianne Cope, was born in Germany on January 23, 1838, and immigrat-



ed with her parents to New York when she was 2 years old. In August of 1862 she went to the sisters of the Third Order of Saint Francis in Syracuse, New York and took her vows the next year.

Her early religious life saw her working as a teacher and administrator for local Catholic schools until she was called upon by the bishop to use her administrative skills as superior of St. Joseph's Hospital in Syracuse, New York. She devoted herself to the care of the sick and infirm and the hospital flourished under her leadership. As the Provincial Mother of her order in Syracuse, Cope, along with six other sisters, she answered a call made by the Hawaiian government to run the Kaka'ako Branch Hospital on Oahu that served as a receiving station for people suspected of having leprosy.

Of the more than 50 religious communities in the United States and Canada who were asked by the government to help the suffering communities and hospitals for those with leprosy (Hansen's disease) in Hawaii, Mother Marianne and her sisters were the only ones to answer the call. They immediately got to work transforming the hospital environment for those with leprosy and their families. Of this mission, she said —

"I am hungry for the work and I wish with all my heart to be one of the chosen ones, whose privilege it will be to sacrifice themselves for the salvation of the souls of the poor Islanders.... I am not afraid of any disease, hence, it would be my greatest delight even to minister to the abandoned 'lepers'."

In 1888, Mother Marianne and two sisters took on an even more challenging assignment and went to the Hawaiian island of Moloka'i, a leper colony, to open a new home devoted to the protection of girls and women with leprosy as well as to take charge of the home that her friend, Saint Damien de Veuster, had established for men and boys. She helped improve life on the island by introducing pride, cleanliness, and a little fun to the colony. She often provided bright scarves and dresses for the women she served and cheerfully carried out her mission until she died on August 9, 1918. While in service, she was awarded the Royal Order of Kapiolani by the Hawaiian government for her selfless love and care of those in need and never contracted leprosy. She was canonized in 2012.






