

From the Pastor's Desk...



Our very dedicated and perceptive Parish Secretary, Donna Kothera, recently presented me with the following August 29, 2010, Bulletin Column from the late Fr. Jon Bakkelund, which he wrote at the end of his assignment at St. Thomas where he served as a Seminarian and a Deacon:

"It's hard to believe that my time here is drawing to a close. Fourteen months went by so quickly. It is truly hard for me to say goodbye. Your goodness to me has been felt in every aspect of parish life and in every endeavor I have undertaken. God has truly blessed this parish with faithful Christians who are intent on doing His Will and serving one another. You have much cause for rejoicing. I want to thank you most deeply for your kindness, your warmth, and your generosity of spirit.

I go back to Rome to prepare for priestly ordination (God-willing) in May of 2011. So long as my bishop calls me to ordination, I will be ordained at the Cathedral of St. Peter in Rockford. I hope to celebrate a First Mass of Thanksgiving at my home parish, St. Bridget in Loves Park. I hope to see many familiar 'St. Thomas faces' on what will undoubtedly be one of the happiest days of my life. My residence and place of pastoral formation in Rome will continue to be the Pontifical N. American College. There I will learn how to hear confessions, how to say Mass, I will take some *practica* in marriage counseling, and so forth. I am very excited to again join my brother seminarians on the path to priesthood. For academics I will attend the Pontifical Gregorian University. I will begin the first year of a two-year program with a special focus on Dogma. Of particular interest to me is 'The Doctrine of Grace'. I beg that you keep me in prayer during this upcoming stage in my life.

I imagine anyone who would return to such a beautiful city as Rome would be filled with great excitement to study and to pray at the heart of the Church. But I will admit to you that I carry some sadness along with me because I know this is where God is ultimately call me, to parish life. This is 'what it's all about'. Please know that this year has filled me with greater joy than I have yet experienced in my life. Every day I pray that Our Lord will grant me a shepherd's heart, a heart that will burn with love for souls. Your souls have been so easy to love. Thanks to each and every one of you who has made this year so wonderful. I could never even begin to thank each of you by name but in a particular way I would like to thank the children of St. Thomas School as well as all of our children enrolled in Religious Education. You are each so amazing and I cannot wait to see what God has in store for you. I would like to thank our school staff for your efforts in service of quality Catholic Education. The Church and the world desperately need faithful Catholic teachers. Please always strive to live the ideals that you teach. I would like to thank the Pastoral Center Staff. I hope you understand what you mean to me and how fondly I will remember you. Sadly, your efforts are sometimes known to God alone, but one day in heaven we will each be able to see clearly the fruits of our labor.

Finally, thank you to my brothers, Monsignor Hermes, Father Simon, Father Barr, and Father Rafael Tunarosa. Your example and love for the priesthood has been a gift to me that I will never be able to repay. I am so grateful to God for having been able to develop such a deep relationship with each of you and I cannot wait to join your ranks as a brother priest!

Dear Good People, again, thank you. I promise you my daily prayers for the rest of my life. You will always be remembered quite fondly by this deacon of yours. God bless you and protect your families. **Sincerely in Christ, Deacon Jon."**I am sure I speak for a great many when I say, Dear Father Jon Bakkelund, may you now realize the kind embrace of our Savior, Jesus Christ, as he welcomes you into the gates of heaven, and says to you, "Well done my good and faithful servant".


