From the Pastor's Desk...



Only after venturing into the desert and submitting to the temptations of Satan is Jesus free to begin his public ministry. He was surrounded by wild beasts! He emerges from that trial with his central theme: "This is the time of fulfillment. The reign of God is at hand! Reform your lives and believe in the good news." This message of Jesus is worth closer examination as we begin our Lenten experience.

"The time of fulfillment." We often think of time in terms of calendars and watches. Time is mathematical and easily quantified: 60 seconds equals one minute; 60 minutes equals one hour, and so on. This notion of time is referred to as *Chronos* by the Greeks. *Chronos* time is uneventful and lacking in personal meaning. On the oth-

er hand, there is what the Greeks called *Kairos* time. This is the time that is beyond measurement because it is so deep with meaning. *Kairos* time is the inbreaking of the sacred into the profane and ordinary things of this world. Jesus is speaking of *Kairos* time. God is doing a new thing in Jesus. Jesus not only announces the fullness of God's presence, but Jesus is the fullness of God's presence. What the prophets of the Old Testament longed to see, God's salvation, is here in Jesus.

"The reign of God is at hand!" Nowhere in scripture is the reign or kingdom of God defined. Jesus' audience knew well what it meant. God's active rule and presence in human history and in the history and life of Israel was reaching its zenith. The reign of God cannot be limited to a geographical area or equated with military power. The reign of God is the transforming presence of God in the hearts of men and women. This active presence of God is not for the end of the world or even for the end of the week. God's rule is now!

"Reform your lives." If we really hear the preaching of Jesus and respond to his message and person, this costs us something. We will need to *change*. However, this change is not a mere shallow rearrangement of our schedules, likes and dislikes, or the way we spend our leisure time. It is a process of having one's heart of stone transformed into a heart of flesh. In other words, it is a continual daily commitment of placing Christ first in our lives, and making sure he sits on the throne all that guides us. This will require Christ-like attitudes and values. It will require a way of being very different than many of society's accepted norms and customs. The structure of history and our lives are radically changed by and through Jesus.

"Believe in the Good News." Jesus challenges his audience and us to believe that in him God is doing salvation. Authentic belief requires that we live our personal and community lives in such a way so as to give evidence that Jesus is Lord. Authentic belief is more than mere correct doctrine; it also requires correct acting in our everyday lives. A first step in this direction is to believe that Jesus is the Good News of God. Jesus is the news and announcement that God is a passionate, saving, loving Father who wants to share his life with us. We must resist the temptation to turn the Good News of Jesus into mere information.

Come, Holy Spirit, take hold of our lives, and help us embrace the spirituality of Lent, which sees all our Lenten practices as sincere attempts to live fuller lives with the Lord Jesus as our Master and Guide.
