

From the Pastor's Desk...



The Diocese of Rockford is prayerfully considering a potential Diocesan Wide Capital Campaign. A Feasibility Study has been initiated that will guide any plan of action before moving forward with this initiative. They have engaged CCS Fundraising, a non-profit consulting firm with over 75 years of experience in the Church, to guide this effort. Through this Feasibility Study, dialogue and input will be sought (from clergy, lay leaders and as many parish members as possible throughout the diocese) on furthering the priorities of our diocese through a possible Capital Campaign. (Please see the insert in this bulletin for your opportunity to respond to a Feasibility Study Electronic Survey).

The goal of this Campaign is to meet current and future needs of our diocese, including

the following:

Ensure the Vitality of our Parishes (107 Catholic Parishes, including 2 Missions)

Support and Serve our Communities and Families (411,932 Catholic Families) including:

- 3 Catholic Hospitals assisting 431,833 patients per year
- 2 Catholic Health Care Centers assisting 471 patients per year
- 3 Homes for the Aged assisting 695 residents per year
- 1 Day Care Center assisting 81 children per year
- 7 Special Centers for Social Services assisting 29,139 per year
- 12 Seminarians currently receiving support from our diocese

Strengthen Catholic Education and Evangelization:

- St. Anthony College of Nursing serving 202 students
- 6 Diocesan High Schools serving 1,863 students
- 2 Religious Order High Schools serving 709 students
- 29 Catholic Elementary Schools serving 6,199 students
- Religious Education Programs serving 3,361 HS students / 24,331 Elementary students

Each parish has individual needs, which may range from maintenance and capital improvement projects to investment in parish-level programs. A percentage of all funds raised in this potential Campaign will be allocated to local parish needs as determined by each individual parish, with the potential for a more generous over-goal share.

Here at St. Thomas the Apostle, we have been in the process of identifying many of these needs. Last Summer, we hired and are currently working with Chris Mominey of Avanti Advisors to assist in forming the future direction of our school, with an eye on enhancing Communications, Marketing, and Enrollment efforts. The future is looking promising. We will be hearing more about that in the upcoming months.

We have also been attending to many capital projects that have simply needed to be addressed at the present time (parking lots, school boilers, plumbing repairs, lighting updates, tuckpointing, etc.). We have much more to accomplish, but we must enhance our current savings for this to happen.

As in past generations, we find ourselves in a time of unique challenges, but also unique opportunities. I am confident that as a people of faith we will rise to meet these challenges and opportunities, both on the Diocesan and Parish levels. Thank you for your faith and generosity!

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

It has been a joy to start off the season of Lent with you here at St. Thomas. It was especially lovely to see so many of you at the Shroud of Turin presentation — what a powerful reminder of how much the Lord has done for us in His humanity so your and my life can be renewed and full of life!

On Tuesday, March 5, I would like to invite you to a talk I am giving here at the Oak Street community room. It will summarize and present the key parts of the book we gave away at Christmas, Bishop Robert Barron's This is My Body: A Call to Eucharistic Revival. Bishop Barron has so many beautiful insights, using the riches of Scripture and our Tradition to showcase what Jesus Christ desires for us as His people: to renew us as a community here at St. Thomas with nothing less than His very self, truly present Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity in the holy Eucharist. After the talk, there will be the opportunity for small-group discussion at your table and a brief Q&A session about the book and the Eucharistic Revival in general.

This talk is one of many opportunities to engage with your faith during Lent, as well as an opportunity to invite someone back to church who has slipped out of a more-engaged practice of the faith. As the ending of Mass exemplifies by sending us forth into the "real world" around us renewed by this Presence in Holy Communion, the celebration of our faith in the great gift of the Eucharist is intimately tied to a call to mission and evangelization. This evening could be a great expression of that if we invite just one person to join us!

Know of my prayers for each of you during this holy season, when we are orienting our desires toward what truly satisfies our hearts and makes life full: the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ – present in the Church, present in her sacraments, especially the Eucharist, and present in each of us who have "eyes to see and ears to hear". Please pray for me, too.
