From the Pastor's Desk...



A couple of challenging questions arise from the Easter-time Scripture readings. Each question deals with the subject of "where" being asked by a close follower of Jesus. "Where have they put him?" and "Where are you going?"

In Scripture, a question is often answered with another question. In both these instances, the where-questions are responded to with why-questions.

The first reframed, where-question in Luke's Gospel is on Easter: to Mary of Magdala and the other women to their question of "where have they put him?" Why do you look for the living among the dead? Jesus is not a body to be anointed with spices.

Jesus is very alive and quite well.

The second re-framed question, "Where are you going" (from Peter in John's Gospel) is answered in today's Gospel with another why-question: Why do you stand here looking up to heaven? You are looking in the wrong place. Jesus is Emmanuel, meaning "God with us".

The question, "Why do you look for the living among the dead?" is an important one for us in our day. We are called to believe that Jesus is alive. This is the message of Easter. Our challenge is to be spiritual people. Our challenge is to listen to spiritual people and be inspired by the Holy Spirit. Jesus has not left us orphaned. We must not seek the living among the dead. This is also evident in the gift of the Eucharist, our central Sacrament. Jesus feeds us with the very gift of Himself so that He can more fully reside within us.

There is a separate challenge to the second question, the one we heard in our Gospel, "Why do you stand here looking up to heaven." To intentionally mix our metaphor, we are not to stand here sitting on our thumbs. We are called to do something, to be alive as a follower of Jesus, to become the person we called to become.

There was not distance but closeness to Jesus after the Ascension. The gift of presence is part of the blessing that Jesus gave to his disciples and to us as he left. He fulfills his blessing to be here in Eucharist, in our community, among friends and families.

This weekend, we are blessed to welcome two new priests into our diocese and three new transitional deacons. Please offer your prayers and thanks for Fr. Ryan Nooraee and Fr. Ian Ordonez, and our new deacons, Patrick Glanville, Bailey Peterson, and Mike Wojnarowski. We also congratulate Bill Kearly from St. Mary in Woodstock who is being ordained for the neighboring diocese of Madison, Wisconsin.

Prayer After Meals

Just as praying before a meal, praying after a meal is meant to inspire in Christians an attitude of thanksgiving and an acknowledgment of our dependence on God.

Though it is a less common practice in the modern world, early Church fathers like Tertullian and St. Jerome extolled the importance of praying after a meal, and the Christian poet Prudentius composed hymns for before and after meals ("ante cibum" and "post cibum").

There are no "official" prayers for after a meal, but the most common one said by Catholics is this: "We give thee thanks, almighty God, for all your benefits, who lives and reigns forever and ever. And may the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God rest in peace." It is a benediction which recalls our perpetual fellowship with the entire Body of Christ, including those who have passed from this life.

Community




