From the Pastor's Desk...



Today we remember Saints Peter and Paul who guided the early Church just after the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Each of these two saints is important for different reasons. Peter was the first Pope and kept the Church united as it grew very rapidly in the early years following Pentecost. In the first years after Pentecost, it was mostly the Jewish people who accepted Jesus as the Savior and so the early Church was a very Jewish Church. But as time went on, the newly converted (Saul) Paul began to preach also to non-Jewish people, the Gentiles as they were called. His preaching was very successful, and he brought huge numbers of non-Jewish people into the Church, so much so that the number of Jewish people in the Church was greatly outnumbered by non-Jewish people.

So, both Peter and Paul had very important tasks in the early Church. Peter worked to maintain unity in the Church, which during his lifetime had already spread throughout the Middle East and Europe. Paul reminded the Jewish people that Jesus is the fulfillment of their Old Testament hopes, and taught the Jewish people and the Gentiles that Jesus is indeed the Savior.

It is interesting to note the personalities of both Peter and Paul. Peter was impetuous. On the evening of Holy Thursday, telling Jesus that he would die with Him if necessary (John 13:37) but later that night he three times denied that he knew Jesus or had any association with Him. We also remember Peter's strong objection to Jesus' prediction that He would suffer and die in Jerusalem and Jesus' reply to Peter, "Get behind me Satan, because the way you think is man's way and not God's way." (Matt 16:23). Yet, what made Peter a suitable candidate for Jesus' call was his love for Jesus, so three times the Risen Jesus asked Peter if he loved Him and asked him to look after the flock (John 21:15-19).

Paul was a controversial character in his own way. He had a fiery personality. In his early life, he channeled that fire towards persecuting the Christians in Jerusalem, even witnessing the death of Stephen, the first martyr for Jesus (Acts 8:1). After his conversion, Paul's preaching was fiery and upset the Churches. Why did God call Paul? Paul was a highly educated Pharisee (Acts 22:3), and it would only be someone like him who could see that the Jewish expectations were fulfilled in Jesus. Paul had the strong personality needed for that daring challenge. These two founding fathers and great saints answered the call of Jesus and built upon the foundation our Lord set in place with the Paschal Mystery. Since this Feast falls on Sunday this year, we highlight their importance to our own calling.

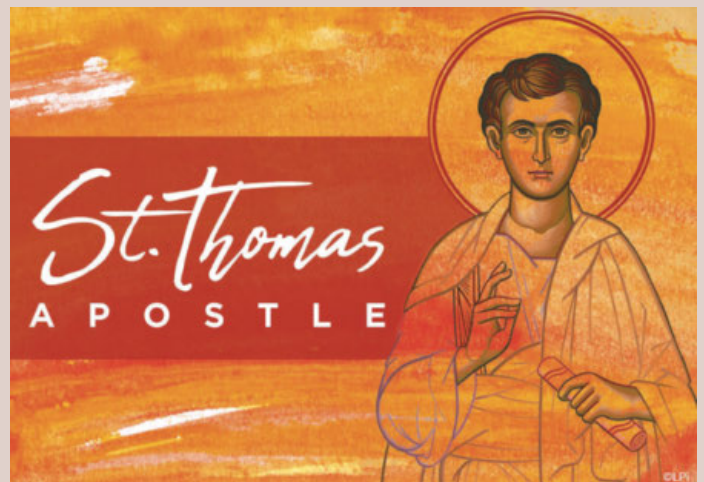

Pilgrimage

A pilgrimage is a journey to a place of spiritual significance undertaken by one who is seeking closeness to Heaven while still on Earth.

When the time came for the Transfiguration of Christ, Jesus took three of his disciples to “a high mountain by themselves,” indicating that the sacred mysteriousness of this moment was something best experienced apart from the routine of ordinary life. This is the principle behind the act of pilgrimage: a journey to a place of spiritual significance, undertaken by one who is seeking closeness to Heaven while still on Earth.

Christian pilgrimages really began in the fourth century, when churches in the Holy Land were constructed in locations associated with the life of Christ. Throughout the centuries, pilgrims have likewise flocked to sites of Marian apparitions, miracles, and to places connected with the lives of saints. Some of the most iconic pilgrimage destinations include Fatima, Lourdes, and the Santiago de Compostela in Spain.

The Priesthood and the Eucharist

“These two Sacraments were born together,” wrote St. John Paul II of the priesthood and the Eucharist, “and their destiny is indissolubly linked until the end of the world.”

The Eucharist is such a beautiful example of how God, conscious of our limitations, bends to meet us. He once came to us cloaked in the flesh, that we might recognize Him. Now He comes as the very means by which we nourish ourselves: food and drink, the most familiar and comforting thing in the world to us. How easy He makes it to fulfill his command that we become one with Him. How generous He is to make such a sacred thing also accessible.

We can say the same of the priesthood, and of the men He calls to its number. How generous of Him to make such an accessible thing — our sons, our brothers, our uncles, our cousins — sacred. How generous of Him to allow these human creations — who share in our own faults — to be the means through which He comes to us in the Eucharist.

Without the Eucharist, we would have no eternal life. Without priests, we would have no Eucharist. On this, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, let’s give thanks for our priests, and redouble our prayers that God will send us good and holy ones — manna from Heaven in our wandering exile.

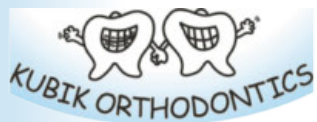

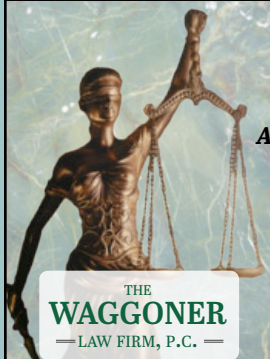
