From the Pastor's Desk...



A number of parish members have understandably become concerned with the treatment of immigrants in our country. Please know that I share your concerns. Perhaps it would be helpful to relook at Catholic Social Teaching on Immigration and Movement of Peoples. I turn to the U.S. Bishops' pastoral statement *Welcoming the Stranger Among Us: Unity in Diversity*, which is firmly grounded in the Church's social teaching.

The statement focuses on three basic principles of Catholic Social Teaching on Immigration:

First: People have the right to migrate to sustain their lives and the lives of their families.

Second: A country has the right to regulate its borders and to control immigration.

Third: A country must regulate its borders with justice and mercy.

Some may find principles one and two to come in conflict with each other. However, principles one and two must always be understood in the context of principle three. And all Catholic social teaching must be understood in light of the absolute equality of all people and the commitment to the common good.

A country's regulation of borders and control of immigration must be governed by concern for all people and by mercy and justice. A nation may not simply decide that it wants to provide for its own people and no others. A sincere commitment to the needs of all must prevail. Last weekend's Gospel on the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37) provides us with a strong message from our Lord on how we are to be good neighbors for all.

Recent actions by the current administration regarding the treatment of immigrants have understandably come under fire by Pope Leo XIV and our bishops. Increasingly, there seems to be little regard for the due process of law and the rights of all people to be treated with a certain level of dignity. Detention centers like Alligator Alcatraz are concerning by their very name and even more so by the very cruel and inhumane treatment of the individuals that have been placed there.

Both the Old and New Testaments tell compelling stories of refugees forced to flee because of oppression. Jesus reiterates the Old Testament command to love and care for the stranger, a criterion by which we shall be judged: "For I was hungry, and you gave me food, I was thirsty, and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me" (Mt. 25:35).

Immigration is always a very politically charged issue, and I strive to steer clear of politics, but when basic human rights are being so blatantly disregarded, it is a Christian duty to condemn these actions.







Martha's Burdens

It's time to admit it: I've been unfair to Mary in the past. Been a little catty about her. Oooh, Mary, she's so holy. Well, do you like to eat, Mary? Who made your lunch? Yeah, that's right: it was Martha. Because you know what? It's the Marthas who get things done in the world while the Marys lounge around reading Aquinas and attending silent retreats and going to Eucharistic Adoration whenever they want.

And there you have it, folks: my bitterness on full display! I tend to identify with Martha, not with Mary, and I need to stop doing that.

Because I am not Martha instead of Mary. I am both. We are all both.

Mary was a woman; she was expected to do the serving, too. She shared that burden; she wasn't abandoning it, heaping her portion on Martha. And it's so wrong to assume that Mary didn't have the same cares and anxieties as Martha — perhaps she even had more!

Here's the difference: Mary, unlike Martha (and me, I guess) knew where to go with them.

We typically see our burdens as an impediment to a relationship with Christ. I'm so busy. I'm so overwhelmed. There are so many demands on me, on my time, on my person, on my finances. Take a number, Jesus. Get in line. But we're thinking the wrong way. Burdens aren't an obstacle that stands between us and Christ. Burdens are the straightest path to his feet.

God knows about burdens, okay? Aside from being allwise and all-knowing, he basically completed a doctorate in suffering, taking on a human form (itself kind of a burden, if you think about it) and for 33 years lived among the hardest and heaviest burdens this world has to offer.

Why did he do this? Well, part of the reason was so that we could finally understand that our burdens aren't a barrier between us and God. On the contrary, they connect us to him.

Are you anxious about many things? Then you need to be right where Mary is: at the feet of Jesus, with all your burdens.

St. Bridget of Sweden | July 23

Saint Bridget or Birgitta was born in 1303, the daughter of Birger Petersson, governor of Uppland and his wife Ingeborg Bengtsdotter. She was married to Ulf Gudmarsson, who became governor of the province of Neri-

cia. They had eight children, all of whom survived past infancy which was rare for the 12th century. One of their daughters would become St. Catherine of Sweden.

Saint Bridget was hailed as a mystic and her visions, which



began in her early childhood when she had visions of Christ Crucified, made her somewhat of a Middle Ages celebrity. Her vision of the Nativity of Jesus even influenced the art of the Nativity through the Baroque era! She is said to have predicted the Vatican State. Saint Bridget's Revelations, which she dictated to Peter Olafsson, the prior at the Cistercian monastery of Alvastra near which she retired after her husband's death in 1344, were published in 1492. They have since been published in many languages and can still be purchased today.


Some of her most profound visions regarded the founding of a new religious order which would be primarily for women, ruled by an abbess, but with a separate house for monks who would serve as order chaplains. Her visions detailed everything from the abbey church to the clothing that would be adopted as the nun's habit, and how the order would be ruled. King Magnus II of Sweden granted Bridget land and buildings. The order, called the Bridgettines or the Order of the Most Holy Savior was approved by Pope Urban V in 1370.


Saint Bridget was canonized in 1391 by Pope Boniface IX and in 1999 Pope John Paul II named her one of the Patron Saints of Europe.


