

From the Pastor's Desk...



This year's Respect Life Month is especially meaningful, since this year we mark the 30th anniversary of Pope St. John Paul II's great encyclical *Evangelium Vitae* (*The Gospel of Life*). The landmark encyclical is one of the most important events in the history of the Pro-Life movement. It is nothing less than a comprehensive manifesto for the movement. Not only does it provide a robust and comprehensive philosophical and theological defense of the Pro-Life worldview, but it is also a clarion call to effective action.

Far from being a relic of the 1990's, *Evangelium Vitae* reads almost like it was written for 2025. In the document, Pope St. John Paul II warned of a "conspiracy

against life" that manifests itself in abortion, euthanasia, artificial reproduction, assisted suicide, and many other assaults on human dignity, all of which are linked together and are all the fruit of the same rotten tree.

Bishop Daniel E. Thomas, Chairman of the USCCB Committee on Pro-Life Activities said, "Every day we witness the overwhelming disregard for human life: through rising rates of abortion and assisted suicide; the killing of innocent school children, even at prayer; the mistreatment of our immigrant sisters and brothers as they endure an environment of aggression; and political and ideological violence inflicted against unsuspecting victims. These attacks threaten life precisely when it is most vulnerable and in need of protection."

When *Evangelium Vitae* was first issued in 1995, it was striking for its comprehensive vision. Pope St. John Paul II was not content to single out abortion or euthanasia in isolation. Instead, he saw them as part of a larger mentality. At its root, he argued, the "culture of death" arises when human beings see themselves not as creatures with a dignity bestowed upon them by God, but as autonomous masters of life and death. When autonomy is raised above the sanctity of life, the strong inevitably impose their will on the weak.

He contrasted this with the "culture of life," which recognizes that life is sacred because it is created by God and entrusted to us. "In giving life to man," he wrote, "God demands that he love, respect, and promote life. The gift thus becomes a command, and the command is itself a gift" (no. 52). "Man, as the living image of God, is willed by his Creator to be ruler and lord," he said. Given this, "man is not the absolute master and final judge, but rather – and this is where his incomparable greatness lies – he is the 'minister of God's plan'" (no. 52). So, let us pray that we can all be good and conscientious 'ministers of God's plan' in promotion of the Gospel of Life!

Ante Dios no podemos fingir ni aparentar: Él nos conoce profundamente. Por más cara de buenos que pongamos, Él ve más allá: ve nuestro corazón. Tampoco podemos decirle cuán buenos somos, porque nos conoce y sabe perfectamente nuestras acciones. Hoy, Jesús nos cuenta otra parábola: la de dos hombres que fueron al templo a orar. Cada uno lo hace a su manera, y al escuchar el relato, nos damos cuenta de que uno lo hace mejor que el otro. Pero lo más importante es que los dos hablan con Dios. Con este ejemplo podemos aprender a orar y a presentarnos ante Dios tal como somos. "Efectivamente, el fariseo, a pesar de las obras, perdió la justicia; el publicano, en cambio, se granjeó la justicia por la humildad de sus palabras. Aunque, a decir verdad, la del publicano no era propiamente humildad: de hecho, la humildad se da cuando uno que es grande se humilla a sí mismo. La actitud del publicano no fue humildad, sino verdad: sus palabras eran verdaderas, pues él era un pecador" - San Juan Crisóstomo (350–407), Homilía 2 sobre la Penitencia.

"Pero, aunque somos pecadores, no debemos desalentarnos, porque el Señor está con nosotros, quien nos ha dado todo y nos hará vencer también este pequeño paso de hoy, con la gracia de la fuerza, de la valentía, de la oración, de la vigilancia y de la alegría" (Papa Francisco). En conclusión: puede ser que en cada uno de nosotros vivan un fariseo y un publicano. Ambos necesitan de Dios para ser liberados y perdonados. Ante Dios, oremos con verdad y con sinceridad de corazón.

Retreats

Spiritual retreats are an act of removing oneself from one's daily life for a period of prayer and reflection, with the intent of returning to that daily life transformed.

It was Christ himself who was the greatest and earliest advocate of spiritual retreat. In the Gospels, he is constantly depicted as withdrawing from other people to be alone in prayer. Likewise, participants in a modern retreat most often go somewhere like a retreat center to seek silence, solitude and communion with God. There are many different varieties of retreats; they can be guided and take place in a group setting, or they can be undertaken alone by just one person. Some are focused on a specific topic or theme; some are defined by periods of total silence. Though clerics are compelled by canon law to go on retreat regularly, all faithful are encouraged to make retreat part of their spiritual life. ©LPi


