From the Pastor's Desk...



The great prophet Isaiah cries out, *"O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord."* He is calling for us all to climb to the top of the mountain and look for the Lord's advent, the Lord's coming into our lives. That, my friends, is how we usher in a new Liturgical Year in our Church.

The problem many of us face is that we are so concerned about many things. Often these are legitimate concerns and worries. Things are thrust upon us by the world in which we live. We can get so caught up in all the events of our days that we do not pay attention to our souls. This spiritual blindness is spoken of in biblical language as darkness. What do we do in darkness? Usually, we sleep. We sleep because we shut down, tune out, and turn off.

When we, through accident, through chance, or in some other unexpected event, become aware of God's activity in our lives, we suddenly pay attention. We wake up. In waking up we likely think that God's coming to us is sudden, unexpected, even somewhat startling. God has, however, always been there. God is actively present to us all of the time, each and every day. It's our awareness of God that has changed. God hasn't changed in the slightest way. God is constant. God is always present. It is we who are inconstant, changeable and inattentive.

We live in a time after the arrival of the year 2000 AD. Do you remember our worries when the year 2000 AD arrived and we were told that our computers were not programmed for those digits and might shut down everything with them? We live in the time after September 11, 2001. We live in an age of terrorism. We live in the time after the economic crash of 2008. We live in an economic mess. We live in a time after the world-wide pandemic of 2020. We live in an age of conspiracy theories and rampant mistrust of authority. We would do well to ask ourselves the question: "Where is God in all of this?" and then seriously, during this Advent, pursue answers to that question. Our questions are not denials, they are quests. And God always wants to be sought. All lovers do.

It has been said that the life which is unexamined is not worth living. Every Advent, and indeed every time we come to Mass, Holy Mother Church bids us to examine our lives. As we begin this Advent and this new Liturgical Year, let us reflect upon the words of St. Paul in his Letter to the Romans: *"You know the time; it is the hour now for you to awake from sleep, for our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed; the night is advanced, the day is at hand. Let us then throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; Let us conduct ourselves properly as in the day...Put on the Lord Jesus Christ!"*




