

From the Pastor's Desk...



A parish member, T.K. O'Hagan, recently shared the following story with me, which I thought might be good to share with you as we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord during this last week of our Christmas season.

"Sitting at the foot of another Christmas tree, I ponder the miracle of an innocent baby Jesus born two thousand years ago. How could the almighty God, creator of all things, become this little child for you and me?"

Perhaps some hint in the story of something my father did for me many years ago. He grew up in a very poor family, outside of Belfast, Northern Ireland. Being Catholic

meant you were treated much the same as the people of color were treated in the deep south of the United States before civil rights legislation of the 1960's. Simple things and a simple faith defined him.

He liked to walk and so did I. When I was six or seven years old, I was walking home from Mass one Sunday, in Chicago, with my dad. I decided I wanted to walk up and down each block rather than walk directly home. My dad could have walked the straight path home and let me take the long way by myself. He also could have simply said, "No". Neither of these responses came from my dad. He chose to walk with me the whole long way home as if it were the best possible way a father and his son could walk home. What an act of accompaniment. What an act of love.

Isn't it a shame we often fail to see love in some things till time and distance move us from their embrace? How might this story offer us some hints of what Christmas is really all about?

God could have trumpeted His commands without even showing Himself. He could have come as a gigantic figure on magnificent clouds of glory. He could also have come as a powerful person immune to our feeble weapons and slurs. That clearly was not His way. He chose to walk among us. He chose to become one of us. Perhaps, because this was the best possible way He could help us walk back Home (to Heaven)."

Today, as we celebrate the gifts of the Magi, we are reminded that they followed a different path. They chose to turn from the path marked out by Herod and to instead follow the path set out before them by God. Lord, please steer us on that same path to You!

Epiphany of the Lord

The song "We Three Kings" details the gifts of the Magi, but do you know what you're singing? "Born a king on Bethlehem's plan, gold I bring to crown Him again." This one is the most straightforward - gold symbolizes the Kingship of Christ. "Myrrh is mine: its bitter perfume breathes a life of gathering gloom." Myrrh is an embalming spice. Already at Christ's birth, we have the symbolic reminder of his death. "Frankincense to offer have I. Incense owns a deity nigh." In many religious traditions, incense symbolizes prayers rising to heaven. In some pagan traditions, it is thought to help "call down" the deity. The gift of frankincense symbolizes Jesus' role as the Great High Priest, sanctifying the world through his sacrifice.



The story of the Wise Men bringing gifts to Jesus, the newborn King, is a great one, isn't it? They had a great big star in the sky to lead the way. I am no Boy Scout, so I am not sure how well I would do following a star like that. But the important point here is that God led them to the manger. The manger was a place that unless God specifically showed you this was where the Christ Child was born you wouldn't have believed it. You would have passed on by.

In our lives, there are no big stars in the sky leading us where we need to go. It isn't so easy sometimes discerning where God is leading us. We may seek to use our gifts wisely, but in what manner and to what end is not always clear.

This is where prayer can make a huge difference. If we seek to cultivate a prayer life where we are mindful of the presence of God throughout our day, then the call is easier to discern. We can help the process by intentionally offering to God in the morning the entirety of the day to come: all our actions, all our time, and all our decisions. In the evening, we can examine the past hours of the day and reflect on when we responded well to Christ's call and when we fell short. Then we resolve to begin again tomorrow, inviting Christ to be with us every step of the way. God may not offer a star in the sky to lead us, but if we invite us on our journey each day, the path will be much clearer. ©LPI

Epiphany Blessing

The Epiphany household blessing is a centuries-old tradition that invokes God's blessing on all who enter one's home.

All you need for an Epiphany blessing is chalk, which is usually made available by parishes either on the feast of the Epiphany or in the weeks leading up to it. There are a few different formulas for blessings out there, but the essence of the ritual is always the same: a priest or the head of the household calls down God's blessing on the house and everyone who comes into it, and an inscription is made above the door in chalk.

The inscription reads: the first two digits of the year + C + M + B + the last two digits of the year. The initials C, M and B represent the names of the magi — Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar — and also signify the Latin phrase *Christus mansionem benedicat*: "May Christ bless the house." ©LPI



Are Catholics obligated to attend Mass each Sunday, or receive Communion each Sunday?

The questions about Mass attendance and the reception of Holy Communion are clearly outlined in what are traditionally called the "Precepts" of the Church. These specific teachings are intended to stand alongside the Ten Commandments as fundamental practices for Catholics and are outlined in the *Code of Canon Law*. The obligations related to Mass attendance and receiving Communion are outlined in the first and third precepts, which we find quoted in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (no. 2042):

The first precept ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor") requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord as well as the principal liturgical feasts honoring the mysteries of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the saints; in the first place, by participating in the Eucharistic celebration, in which the Christian community is gathered, and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days.

The third precept ("You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season") guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian liturgy.

Rather than seeing these as obligations that are simply to be fulfilled out of a sense of duty, Pope Saint John Paul II reminds us of the grace that is made available to us when we gather for Sunday celebrations of the Eucharist: "Sunday is the day which is at the very heart of the Christian life... Time given to Christ is never time lost, but is rather time gained, so that our relationships and indeed our whole life may become more profoundly human" (*Dies Domini*, no. 7).




