

# **OUR NEARLY NU STORE**


Perhaps most of us are just used to the Nearly Nu store. And perhaps we might not fully realize all that the store does for our parish and for the folks of Valley City and the surrounding area. It's easy to take something like the Nearly Nu store for granted

as it's been around for so long and so much a part of the life of this city. But how about this for some news: in 2024 the Nearly Nu store brought in just over \$400,000 in income. Out of those earnings were given \$17,000 to our church, \$12,000 to the Religious Education program, and \$35,000 to the school! That's \$64,000 to our parish's budget, and we would be hard-pressed to make that up if it weren't for the store and its annual gifts. We can all be very proud of the Nearly Nu store - and we can be proud of how it serves the local community. What a blessing our store has brought to our parish, and how Our Lord must be appreciative of what it is doing for all His own brothers and sisters who shop there, work there, volunteer there, and donate and consign items.

However . . . and isn't there always a "however"? And there is one here, too. However, the expenses for the year of 2024 were \$6,780 more than our income, and anyone can see that we dare not take the Nearly Nu store for granted as if it can operate indefinitely without some additional help. At this time about 1/3 of our income goes to payroll. It is good to provide jobs and to provide the wages as best we can for them. But it also good - and needed - to encourage those who can to volunteer their time and efforts in keeping that store open. We certainly want the Nearly Nu to continue financially supporting our parish and school as much as possible but we need some more volunteers. The store takes in hundreds of items daily which need to be sorted, entered into computer (if consigned), tagged, put on the sales floor, etc. If you are interested in volunteering or applying for a paid position, please contact Amanda Kunze at 701-490-1724 or by e-mail at kunzeamanda@gmail.com.

- The store is currently looking for volunteers and/or hiring for Wednesdays.
- The store needs a custodian: 6 hours per week (3 days of 2 hours) at \$30/hr. This can be done before or after store hours.
- The store needs a clerk to work an occasional 1/2 day or a full day on Saturday. This could be a volunteer or paid position.
- The store is looking for a Consignment/Donation Greeter: to volunteer one's time by greeting and assisting consigners/donors with a smile.
- The store is looking for a volunteer with the time and talent to create a new and functional website for the Nearly Nu.

I truly hope that we do get some volunteers from our parish to give a few hours of their time and talent to this very unique ministry. Pass this information on to anyone - parishioner or no - who might be interested. The Nearly Nu store is for everyone who can make use of it - and that includes those who volunteer and work to help it operate.





# STEPS TO SAINTHOOD

The process of canonization in the Catholic Church is a rigorous journey that declares a person to be a saint. It involves several stages overseen by the Church to ensure that the candidate's life reflects exceptional holiness and fidelity to God. Here are the main steps:

## 1. Servant of God

The process begins after the candidate has passed away and a minimum of five years has elapsed (though this can be waived by the Pope, as in the case of John Paul II and Mother Teresa).

The local bishop investigates the candidate's life, virtues, and reputation for holiness, collecting testimonies and documents. If the investigation is deemed satisfactory, the bishop sends the results to the *Dicastery for the Causes of Saints* in Rome (previously named the Congregation for the Causes of Saints), and the candidate is titled Servant of God.

### 2. Venerable

The Dicastery for the Causes of Saints examines the candidate's life and writings to determine whether they demonstrated heroic virtue—a life of extraordinary goodness and closeness to God. If approved, the Pope declares the candidate Venerable.

## 3. Beatification

For a martyr, no miracle is required; their death must be verified as a direct witness to the faith.

For a confessor (someone who lived a holy life but did not die as a martyr), one miracle attributed to their intercession must be verified. This typically involves a medically unexplained healing approved by a team of doctors, theologians, and ultimately the Pope.

Once the miracle is confirmed, the candidate is declared Blessed in a special ceremony. Beatification allows for limited public veneration, often in the candidate's diocese or region.

## 4. Canonization

A second miracle, occurring after beatification, must be verified for both martyrs and confessors.

Following a thorough investigation, the Pope officially declares the candidate a Saint in a canonization ceremony, making them universally venerated in the Church. The new saint is assigned a feast day and becomes a model for the faithful.

Canonization is not about perfection but recognizes a person who has cooperated fully with God's grace and can inspire others in their journey of faith.

# EUCHARISTIC MIRACLES

Carlo Acutis undertook a remarkable project to catalog Eucharistic miracles from around the world, using his skills in technology to create a website that made these miracles widely accessible.

A Eucharistic miracle is an extraordinary event where the bread and wine consecrated during Mass visibly manifest as Christ's body and blood, or where other phenomena affirm the *Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist*. These miracles are seen as divine signs to strengthen faith in the mystery of the Eucharist.

Carlo's website featured descriptions, photographs, and historical information about each miracle, organized in an accessible way. His goal was to help others grow in faith and deepen their devotion to the Eucharist, especially at a time when belief in the Real Presence was waning.

This project is significant because it bridges faith traditions with modern tools, showing how technology can inspire and educate. Carlo's work continues to rekindle love for the Eucharist and remind people of God's tangible presence in their lives.

# TWO MIRACLES

# Healing a Brazilian child

In 2013, a Brazilian boy named Matheus Vianna was healed from a rare pancreatic condition after praying to Acutis and touching one of his relics. Matheus's pancreas was completely healed and he was able to eat normally without restriction.

# Healing a University Student

In 2022, a Costa Rican woman named Valeria suffered a serious head trauma after falling from her bicycle in Florence. Her doctors said she had a very low chance of survival. Valeria's mother prayed to Acutis at his tomb in Assisi, and Valeria began to breathe on her own the same day. She made a full recovery and was discharged from intensive care after 10 days.
