

# Pastor's Page



### THERE'S A DIFFERENCE ...

I've run across sayings in the past that went something like: "Don't just see - observe"; "Don't just hear - listen"; "Don't just read - comprehend"; and others along the same line. I think it's pretty obvious what is trying to be taught in those kinds of sayings: that in any number of activities, it's not enough to do them in a shallow, superficial way, but they should be done methodically, with some effort put in to allow the fullness of the activity be soaked in/understood and not just simply experienced.

And so let me give you a couple of other sayings along the same line, but concerned with things which are - or should be - at the very top of one's life-list of activities:

"You may look lightly upon Scripture and see nothing; meditate often upon it and there you shall see a light like the light of the sun."

That is completely and utterly true. Sacred Scripture is unlike any other literature that has ever been produced. It is the **Word of God**, and although I suppose most everybody would agree with that intellectual description of it, many (and perhaps most) look upon it 'lightly' - if they look upon it at all - and with that kind of approach very little will capture one's mind or heart. But give Scripture consistent attention, and time in pondering it, and it will reveal things to you from the very mind of God that will not leave you unchanged. And the Gospels themselves are the peak moments in the Scripture - the words of the God-man Himself, Our Lord Jesus Christ.

I've been aware of this saying for many years, but this past year it dawned on me that pretty much the same dynamic and pattern could be used in terms of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, with a twist. How about this:


"You may look lightly upon the Eucharist and see nothing; look upon it often and there you shall see a light who is the Son."

That is also completely and utterly true. The Eucharist is unlike any other thing you will run across in your entire life. It is the **Word of God, the Son of God, in His Real Presence**, and although many Catholics would agree with that intellectual description, many (too many) look upon it 'lightly' - if they look upon it at all - and with that kind of approach very little of Our Lord's Real Presence will capture the mind or heart. But give the Eucharist consistent attention, and time in its Presence, and He will reveal Himself in a way that will not leave you unchanged.

And that is the beauty of Eucharistic Adoration: spending time with Our Lord in His Real Presence in the Eucharist. Every Tuesday when our parish has Eucharistic Adoration is the perfect opportunity to stop in for a consistent, weekly time with Christ Himself hidden under the appearance of the bread. As the weeks, months, and years go by, He will become more and more important to you, and His very Person in your life will be the motivation to become a deeper and more faithful disciple of Him.

What about the other six days of the week? Well, we only have Adoration on Tuesdays, but the Lord Jesus is present in our tabernacle 24/7. You can't see the exposed Eucharist as you do at Adoration, but He is Really Present nonetheless - come anytime during the week and spend time with Him as you wish. Living next door to the church is one of the greatest perks I have as a priest - it's so easy and convenient for me to spend time with Him there in the tabernacle that in fact I do just that.

I'm not even going to bring up Holy Communion at this time - that's a whole 'nother topic. This is just about "looking upon Him often" - and the result of such a zealous pursuit. Observing is better than just seeing; listening is better than just hearing; comprehending is better than just reading; and seeing the Light of God in both Scripture and the Eucharist is better than just noticing them in passing.





# **Youth Group News**




# Home on The Range Thank you Shamrock Fundraiser


