

Pastor's Page

THE POOR KID

Last October I went to the Sedona/Prescott area in Arizona for my autumn hiking jaunt. As always, the getaway was fun and the area is scenically magnificent. And then . . . there was one incident at poolside at the motel that struck me and I still remember.

It had been hot that day - 95 degrees - and that was unseasonably hot even for Sedona in October. As I get older that kind of heat wears me out even more than the hiking does. And so by early afternoon I decided to head back out of the sun after a great morning hike and take in some relaxing/reading time by the pool.

For a while I had poolside all to myself. But soon enough a mother and two kids entered the pool area. The two kids began playing together in both the pool and the jacuzzi and the mother was engaged, even though she herself was not in the pool. (I remember when I was a kid - going to the motel pool was always one of the trip's highlights.)

Soon after another family group came into the pool area: this time two parents and one child. The young boy immediately jumped in the pool; the parents for their part immediately sat down at a table near the pool and started looking at/scrolling on their smartphones.

I don't think I could say that the parents were "ignoring" the child in terms of that being what they were intending to do, but the effect was the same - they were not paying any attention to the child - their attention was on the screen in their hands. Being the only kid in that group, he had no one to play with in, and as I watched (with my sunglasses on so they couldn't tell I was watching them) the young boy kept looking at the parents for what I assumed was some attention. But the parents were certainly not paying any attention to him. They were intent upon their smartphones, and never looked up to notice their boy looking their way.

This young boy - now standing still in the pool - started looking at the other family with the mom and two kids laughing and having fun at the other end of the pool, and then looked at his parents who were not engaged with him at all. And . . . to my surprise, he began looking my way. It seemed to me like the poor kid just wanted to have someone to share this time with, and there was no one - he wasn't going to barge in on the other family's fun, and he wasn't going to barge in on the old guy's reading time (me) - and he was not able to get his parent's attention away from their screens.

I felt bad for him. Obviously he had a disadvantage in the fact that he was alone in terms of having other kids his own age to play with at the pool, but his real disadvantage was his parents giving more attention to the screen than to him. (And they weren't relating to each other either - each had their own little world in their hands.) Here they were - a family in Sedona on a beautiful day at the pool, and all three were in fact kind of isolated from each other. The poor kid. And the other family with the mom and two kids were at the other end of the pool having a great time *with each other*.

Of course that was just a small part of one day for this young boy and his two parents. Perhaps they had a great trip and spent some great time *together*. But what I saw was a perfect example of what so often can happen in our techie-world if were not careful - we get caught up in what's "out there" and miss the human experience that we're in at that very time and place.

I wonder if Our Lord is sometimes looking for our attention and we miss Him because we are gazing at the "screen" of the things of this world? In that case, you and I are the "poor kids."



Week 1

Lent is the time to prepare our souls for heaven in a deeper and more intentional way through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. It is also a time to receive God's mercy in our souls through our daily examination of conscience and regular confession. The healing of our sinfulness deepens our love for God and helps us grow in holiness! This is His Holy will for us.

As we prepare for Easter through our Lenten commitments, we also prepare for one of the greatest graced celebrations in the Church year: Divine Mercy Sunday. It's not too early to talk about it. In the next 4 weeks, there will be information regarding Divine Mercy Sunday to help you better understand the importance of this day in the Church and in our own lives. The Feast of Mercy is at the core of the Divine Mercy message.

Here are Jesus's exact words to St. Faustina about the Feast:

"My Daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter of all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy." (Diary 699)

The grace of Divine Mercy Sunday wipes away all our sins. Anyone can rise out of the gutter of their sinfulness on Divine Mercy Sunday, thus allowing a new beginning for the most burdened of sinners.

One of the Church's most joyous celebrations in the liturgical year is the Chrism Mass. At this Mass, the bishop of the diocese blesses all the Holy Oils which will be used throughout the year in the celebration of the sacraments.

The priests renew their commitment to priestly service.

The Oil of the Sick is used in the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The Oil of Catechumens is blessed to strengthen those preparing for Baptism. Sacred Chrism is consecrated for use in the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders, and in other rites such as the blessing of altars and churches.
