

Pastor's Page MEMORIAL DAY

The American federal holiday of Memorial Day is a great way to begin the "summer season." It allows a three-day weekend for the folks who have been cooped up for the long winter/spring seasons to get out, get away, and re-charge at the beginning of the summer season. Of course, in late May the weather oftentimes does not feel much like summer, and this past week it certainly hasn't been a summery feeling as we headed towards Memorial Day. No matter - summertime has arrived and we are ready for some of it, aren't we?

But Memorial Day is also much more important for what it as a holiday celebrates - the sacrifice our fellow citizen-soldiers made of their lives for all of us. We certainly hope and pray for America to be blessed, but we have to also admit that WE are blessed in those who have given their lives for all of us. Their sacrifice made all the "fun" that we look forward to on Memorial Day weekend possible - our family time, outdoor time, the toys we have to play with (for both kids and adults . . .), and everything else that goes into a typical American holiday weekend is there for all of us because of the country we live in and its relative prosperity, and that is due in large part to the sacrifice of those who have gone before us to protect this country and make it the place of freedom that it is.

As All Souls Day on November 2 is the Church's big feast day for those who have passed before us, so Memorial Day is our nation's big commemoration and remembrance of those who have gone before us - and although the holiday itself is directed towards those in the armed forces who have died, it is very often also a national day of visiting cemeteries, placing flowers and tokens at the graves of our loved ones, and bringing that sense of "those who have gone before us" to a place of gratitude in our own hearts.

That being said, the Church has long had a tradition of having Mass at the local Catholic cemetery if that is possible, and that tradition still happens at our parish of St. Catherine's. We will have our annual Memorial Day Mass at our cemetery this Monday morning at 9:30 am - if you come, bring a lawn chair for yourself. Just prior to the Mass at 9:15 am the local Veteran Organizations will conduct military honors in remembrance of those who have died for our country. It's a beautiful way to begin this special day.

It's been a while since I gave any kind of update on the Capital Campaign we had this past fall to "Repair My House." As of this writing, our pledges are at \$1,813,971, or 95% of our goal of \$1.9 million. And the pledges are coming in - thank you!

We have replaced all the roofs at the parish now: the parish office building/school, the rectory, and the church. The flat section of roof between the church and the gym was also replaced. (The gym roof itself was the only roof that did not need to be replaced.) Sometime this summer the steeples will be done - that will be something to see!

The flooring in the basement level of the parish office building/school was replaced, and now that the school year itself is over, the flooring on the first and second floors will be done. The HVAC system is going in slow but sure for the parish office building/school and the gymnasium. The telephone system has now been completely replaced and updated. The front steps of the church and the sewage line in the parish basement will be done this summer. So we are making progress - good progress!

This past Monday we had the drawing for the BIG TICKET RAFFLE - always a fun event! I want to thank all those who helped make this raffle in support of our school a success. We ended up selling 203 tickets - that will add in over \$20,000 to our school's income line item in the budget!

Finally, we had our annual "Graduation Mass" for our 6th graders on Tuesday. A wonderful day to celebrate them and our parish school - and of course always a bit bittersweet, as we will miss those students as they move on in life to more of what the Lord has in store for them. May they grow to be the men and women our Lord created them to be! And may our school always be available for those who wish to make use of it for their children's faith and academic growth.

As I conclude my **third year** as principal, I would like to extend my deepest gratitude **to the entire parish** for your unwavering support throughout this school year. Your generosity, prayers, and encouragement have helped us move forward in faith and mission.

To speak honestly, some projects **needed to be done** and had for quite some time. Now, through your response to the **capital campaign**, many of those long-awaited projects are finally becoming a reality. From the church to the school, this campaign has always been centered on **the needs of the parish**, positioning us to better serve Him for years to come. Your response to this "big ask" has been nothing short of inspiring.

And while we were already engaged in significant efforts, we were also presented with a new question: What should we do with the daycare space after TL Childcare moved out?

We stood on the edge of the unknown. And yet—with faith in God's plan—we said yes. Yes, to something new. Yes, to expanding our mission for the first time in many years. Yes, to opening Little Saints Childcare Center.

I've never had a job where I've had the opportunity to get to know so many families so well. And I've never had a job where I don't get the "Sunday scaries" about going to work on Monday.

This parish is a place of strength. It's a place of service. It's a place of faith. And for me, it's a place of profound gratitude. Thank you for walking with us. May God continue to bless this community we call St. Catherine.




🌺 Knights of Columbus Raffle 👍


