





Pastor's Page

"THE MORAL COMPASS"

That's the name of a book by William Bennett that I purchased back in 1995. It was a follow up to his earlier book entitled "The Book of Virtues". Both books included series of stories and poems with lessons to be learned concerning living a healthy, moral, and virtuous life.

In that second book, "The Moral Compass", Bennett divided the book up into sections, chronologically following a person's life experience. The first section is called "Home and Hearth" and has to do with the early years of a child's life, and the knowledge to be learned and examples to be lived even at those very early years. (Frankly, I'm sure you are as aware as I am that *many* of the life and behavior patterns a person develops find their origins in the first 10 years of life.) He begins each section with a commentary of his own, and when I read his commentary for "Home and Hearth" I knew I wanted to share it with you. Here it is:

All children need bread and shelter. But a true home, of course, is much more than that. Children also need love and order and, because they are not born knowing the difference between right and wrong, a place where they can begin to develop a moral sense. The transmission of virtues is one important reason for a home, and attention to the virtues is one of the important ties that bind a family together. "It is the peculiarity of man," Aristote wrote, "that he alone possesses a perception of good and evil, of the just and the unjust, and of other similar qualities; and it is association in these things which makes a family."

And so home is the place where we receive our first instruction in the virtues. It is our first moral training ground, the place where we can come to know right from wrong through the nurturing and protective care of those who love us more than anyone else. Our character takes shape under the guidance of the dos and don'ts, the instructions, the exhortations we encounter around the house. Equally important, our moral sense emerges under the influence of examples set by mothers, fathers, sisters, and brothers. In the familiar world of home and hearth, we learn the habits of virtue that will fortify us when we venture into the world.

These first lessons stay with us long after we leave home. In our affections and memories, they remain forever a part of us, often the most cherished part of us. "Where shall a man find sweetness to surpass his own home and parents?" Odysseus asks in Homer's Odyssey. "In far lands he shall not, though he find a house of gold." The early experiences of home become a moral compass point, guiding and instructing us for the rest of life's journey.

His words are, in my experience, absolutely true. And, from my priestly perspective, let me add one more thought to his above: it is also in the home that the life of faith is nourished, developed, and matured. So that when sons and daughters leave home as young adults they will never forget not only lessons learned in their younger years, nor leave aside their moral sensibilities of how to live well in themselves and amongst others, as well as not allowing Jesus Christ, His Father, and their Spirit, to fade into the background of their day-to-day lives. What Jesus Christ offers in the Church brings us salvation and perfection in holiness - but our early home life is often one's very foundation.






