



The International Pilgrim Virgin Statue of
Our Lady of Fatima
Tour of Peace 2025
in the Diocese of Fargo
Hosted by WAF/BlueArmy-Fargo Division

Traveling since 1947 after being blessed by the Bishop of Leiria-Fátima, on October 13, 1947, the statue left Fatima and was flown to America to begin its tours to bring the graces of Fatima to those many millions of people who may not otherwise have the opportunity to make a pilgrimage to Fatima itself. The bishop prayed that Our Lady's presence would travel with it wherever she



went. It was blessed again in 1952 by Pope Pius XII, who had crowned the original statue in Fatima as Queen of the world just a few years earlier. The International Pilgrim Virgin Statue has visited more than 100 countries, bringing Mary's powerful message of salvation and hope to millions. Countless favors and graces have been reported wherever the Virgin Statue has traveled.

THE PILGRIM VIRGIN / CATHOLIC CHARITIES / PRESBYTERATE DAYS

This week St Catherine's welcomes the International Pilgrim Virgin Statue to our parish on Wednesday evening and Thursday morning. This statue was blessed in the late 1940's and has been on a continuous tour of the world, having now visited over 100 countries since then and bringing Our Lady's message of salvation and hope in her Son Jesus Christ to as many as she can.

The Pilgrim Virgin statue will be with the priests of the diocese at our Presbyterate Days at Maryvale earlier this week (see below) and then will come to St Catherine's on Wednesday evening (Oct 1) from 6:30 - 7:30 pm for all our youth during the RE time in the church proper. There will be a presentation on the statue by its "guardian" who travels with the statue, then we will offer the Rosary together following. ALL are invited to come to this who wish to. Join our youth in this devotional time to Our Lady!

On Thursday morning (Oct 2) the Pilgrim Virgin statue will be with us at Mass, which this week will be an All-School Mass at 10:30 am. Again, ANY and ALL are invited to join our school students at this special Mass.

You will see a notice about this in another place in the bulletin. I encourage any who can to come for this special opportunity!



Principal's Page



Dear St. Catherine of Alexandria Parish Family,

Last week, I attended the semi-annual Pastor and Principal meetings for the Diocese of Fargo. What a blessing it was to be in the same room with the pastors and principals of all fifteen Catholic schools in our Diocese. There was so much goodness being shared. We celebrated the formation of the **All Saints Catholic Schools Network in Grand Forks** and the establishment of **St. Carlo Acutis Middle School**, which is now the fifteenth school in our Diocese. We also heard about several Catholic schools that are at or near capacity, a sign of the growing hunger for faith-filled education.

Bishop Folda spoke beautifully about the importance of the apostolate of Catholic schools and about his own Catholic school formation. His visible support for the mission of our schools was encouraging and affirming. We also welcomed new principals at Trinity Elementary in West Fargo, St. Alphonsus in Langdon, and St. John's Academy in Jamestown. The Spirit is alive in Catholic education across our Diocese.

What does this mean for **our school**? We are not “bursting at the seams.” We still have room in our classrooms. Yet I trust in the Lord's plan, knowing He works *through us and with us*. The Lord has already provided for this parish and school beautifully—through the **Capital Campaign**, which renewed our facilities, and through the establishment of **Little Saints Childcare Center**.

Our mission is not new, but it is clearer than ever: to fill these spaces with children and families, to let the light of Christ shine through Catholic education, and to share the beauty of our Faith openly and joyfully. His grace is not meant to be hidden—it is meant to be shared freely.

I ask for your prayers, specifically for growth **in enrollment at both Little Saints Childcare and St. Catherine School**. Please pray that every child who comes through our doors receives not only an excellent education, but also a Christ-centered *formation* that glorifies Him.

I would also like to extend a practical invitation: we are seeking a volunteer to be on **doorbell duty** at Little Saints Childcare, 1–2 days a week from 3:00 to 6:00 PM. This means sitting near the door system and letting in parents as they arrive for pick-up. You are welcome to bring a book, knit/crochet, or work quietly on other things during this time. We are happy to provide training. If you feel called to help in this way, please don't hesitate to reach out—I would be very grateful.

Your support is one of my favorite parts of serving here. There is always a parishioner willing to help, always a visible reminder of God's goodness when I come to work and live my faith in unison with this parish family. Together, we continue to inspire excellence through faith, learning, and service.

GIFTS FROM THE HARVEST

(Grain, Corn, Beans, Cattle, Etc.)

SHARING YOUR HARVEST - *more effectively*

Cash basis farmers who harvest their crops in the fall and make their plans for spring planting often find that making charitable gifts is a great way to do tax planning. As with all charity and tax planning, one should first consult his/her financial and legal advisers. The example below, illustrates for many farmers, at least considering a “*gift from the harvest*” might be the most effective way to “*share your harvest.*”

The reasons such a gift might be advantageous are several, but the primary are:

- **Reduction of income** to the extent of the value of the commodity.
- Deduction of **production costs** from the past growing season.
- In many cases, elimination of the **self-employment tax** attributed to the commodity.
- Effective **reduction of adjusted gross income**, helping reduce the income on which tax is assessed, and allowing larger giving not limited to 50% of adjusted gross income.

PROCEDURE in the Diocese of Fargo

To accomplish a “*gift from the harvest*”, be sure to **contact our office at (701) 356-7926 or (701) 361-9757**. We can provide the forms and information by which your elevator may transfer ownership to the Diocese, your parish, school or other ministry directly prior to sale, thereby ensuring the favorable tax treatment desired by such a gift.

When you decide to make a “*gift from the harvest*”, make sure you give our contact information to the elevator, so we can take responsibility for the sale.
