



# Pastor's Page

## ALL HALLOW'S EVE / ALL SAINTS / ALL SOULS

It's that time of the year. We have one holiday and two holy days in this week to come: All Hallow's Eve on Friday, All Saints Day on Saturday, and All Souls Day on Sunday.

Halloween does have its roots as the eve of All Saints Day. Before the day that the "saints coming marching in" the spirits of the darkness have their time to roam the world. I'm not sure how the "trick or treating" got tied into that, but I must admit that Halloween when I was a kid and roaming the north side of Fargo picking up an entire grocery bag full of candy dressed as a skeleton-man was always a lot of fun.

But that eve will sooner or later bring the day to come - the day of All Saints. We celebrate the lives of the saints all year 'round on their particular feast days, but these saints we celebrate on November 1 are all the folks who have passed away from this world into the next and are now before the Face of God. They might not be "canonized" and they (hopefully) include our own loved ones, family and others, who are nevertheless with all the canonized saints in heaven in that family of God we are called and created to be part of.

And then we come to All Souls Day, which we celebrated at this weekend's Masses. We consider - and more importantly pray for - those souls that have passed to the next life, but need that final purification from the Lord God in Purgatory before they are enabled to come before and see the Face of God for themselves. In our Catholic faith we pray for the souls of the dead (in Purgatory) every day of the year, but this is their special "feast day". If possible, today would be a good day if you can to visit a cemetery and pray for the souls of the dead buried there.

So we have a simple compendium of the options available to us depending on how we live and the choices we make: to head down the wrong path away from God, to attain the life of heaven after having passing from this life to the next, and to undergo that final purification most of us will need before we are fit to see God face to face.

And now Advent will be arriving in a few weeks . . .

And speaking of All Saints Day . . . it lands on a Saturday this year, and when that happens . . . it's one of those Holy Days that the obligation is then no longer present to worship at Mass. I will still have one Mass this next Saturday, November 1, at 9:00 am to celebrate Mass for that feast day and make it available to anyone who might wish to come. So - come on over and give praise to God for His saints, and join our parish family in asking for their prayers!

# Principal's Page

Dear St. Catherine of Alexandria Parish Family,

Before writing this week's Principal Page, I asked God to help me figure out what He wanted me to say—because, honestly, I was stumped. There's so much happening, and so many directions pulling at once. This week alone, I helped fill in as the school cook, custodian, classroom teacher, and childcare teacher. I haven't had a single day where I've gone home early.

Before I became principal, I used to get frustrated when my carefully laid plans were interrupted or didn't go as expected. But a big part of having faith is knowing that *I am not the planner*. I am not in charge—He is.

This week, I realized that wherever I'm needed to serve our school is exactly where I'm supposed to be. I have time for a Pre-K student who's excited to share their latest creation. I have time to sit with a three-year-old in Little Saints who needs help understanding expectations. I have time to cook and serve breakfast, and to clean up a mess. What I don't have time for is letting those moments discourage me, my plans are not necessarily His Plans.

I'm not a believer in "positivity always," but I do believe in giving it back to the Lord and letting Him lead. He knew where I needed to be this week—and it certainly wasn't in my office chair. Reframing our mindset is often precisely what He calls us to do, and this week He made sure that lesson came through clearly.

This week's school virtue captures that spirit beautifully:

## The Virtue of Circumspection (Carefulness)

**Definition:** Careful consideration of circumstances and consequences

### Prayer for Circumspection:

*Dear Jesus, my actions affect not just myself, but others. Please give me the wisdom to think before acting. Please give me the gift of counsel, that I may act in the best way at each moment of the day.*

**Circumspection looks like:** Asking for advice from an older, trusted person

**Circumspection sounds like:** "May I ask you for advice about something?"

May we all take time to pause, to reflect, and to listen for where the Lord is calling us to serve—even if it isn't where we planned to be.


