### 2024 REACH Banquet

On Thursday, April 18, 2024, the annual REACH banquet was held at the Valley City Eagles Club with 60 guests in attendance. Music was performed by Valley City High School Choir Students, with Dianna VanBruggen providing piano accompaniment. Most unfortunately, our vocal microphone was not located until after the music was over. However, those sitting in close proximity to the vocalists enjoyed a lovely performance.

Father Paul thanked all in attendance and led the opening prayer. Guests enjoyed a long-popular roast beef entrée with salad, potatoes, vegetables, and dessert.

Jeff Trumbauer, Principal of St. John's Academy in Jamestown, ND, was featured as the keynote speaker. A "cradle Catholic" from Battle Lake, MN, he shared about his journey as a basketball coach and advancement director prior to being called upon by Monsignor Wald to serve as the principal at St. John's. He urged listeners to stay focused on the mission of passing on the faith, remarking that faith and love cannot simply be taught but must be shown by lived example. We are navigating a changing culture. Mass attendance has gone down and annulments have increased, indicating an erosion of faith among the general population. Nevertheless, there is hope: we can overcome the challenges we face through Jesus Christ. While our resources may seem scarce at times, they are abundant compared to what the Apostles had to work with two thousand years ago. God works through each of us, and he is in control. We must be bold in sharing our stories and in fighting for our kids.

Following the keynote address, our annual business meeting was held. REACH celebrated having donated \$15,000 to St. Catherine School for the 2023-2024 school year and welcomed new board members Valerie Holm and James Nelson. Forty-one active members were recognized for their support.

Before the night was over, St. Catherine alumnus Dale Sauer, who has done wood turning since 2008, presented a beautiful handmade wooden bowl to the school, to be donated for the 2024 Fall Auction. His craftsmanship and his generosity were deeply admired by those in attendance.

Mikki Isensee and Carol Knutson won the door prize bouquets, and Father Don Leiphon shared his joy in having been ordained for 55 years. We now look forward to the 2025 banquet, which will take place on April 3.

# From the President's Desk



Greetings REACH members and Friends!

St. Catherine School became a part of my life's journey when I entered kindergarten in 1978, within just a few years of the REACH club's formation. In those days, the Sisters of Maryvale still had a prominent presence within the school. Sr. Debra was my Kindergarten teacher, and Sr. Albert Marie taught my class in second grade. Sr. Mary Severin helped us in the library, and Sr. Eugene Marie taught us French. However I remember that even back then, as a child, I noticed a subtle shift that was happening in this Catholic school and others, as the torch of teaching was gradually being passed from the Sisters, and more broadly, from the religious communities, to the laity.

Today, ample evidence shows that St. Catherine School faculty and staff still manifest a spirit of service and still feel called and intrinsically driven to do the important work that they do. However those faculty and staff live in a different world than the Sisters of Mary of the Presentation (SMP)

educators who preceded them.

North Dakota news outlets reported last year that the average starting teacher salary in North Dakota was just a little under \$21 per hour. To give that better context, keep in mind that teacher salaries in rural areas of the state tend to be at least 15% lower than in urban areas and that the teachers working in our privately funded St. Catherine School have historically made significantly less than their public school counterparts. Meanwhile, the cost of living in our beautiful community of Valley City has continued to increase over time. Unlike their SMP predecessors, today's teachers at St. Catherine may well have student loans to pay and children of their own to support. No amount of faith, altruism, or intrinsic motivation will enable them to literally and figuratively stay present for our children, if the numbers don't balance. This is one of the primary reasons why I have chosen to support REACH in the ways that I do. In supporting the school consistently over time, our organization supports the teachers who have always been, and who remain, so critical to its mission.



<u>Treasured Moments:</u> by Sr. Debra Berry, former educator and first kindergarten teacher at St. Catherine School

As I reflected on what Catholic Education means to me and how it has been an integral part of my life, I remembered my days of going to a Catholic school. When I was six years old, my parents, realizing the importance of Catholic education, enrolled me into St. Patrick's School in Washington, Illinois. I attended all eight grades at St. Patrick's and was privileged to have the Sisters of Mary of the Presentation as some of my teachers. My parents valued their faith and wanted to instill the same love for it in us, their children. Going to St. Patrick's helped to deepen my faith, along with my parents, who took every opportunity to share their faith with me, my sister, and my brother.

After I graduated from High School, I attended a Catholic college for one year before coming to North Dakota to enter Religious Life. The seeds of Religious Life were planted in me by my parents and also by the Sisters of Mary of the Presentation. I am so grateful for the seeds that grew within me and helped me to become the person I am today.

Attending the College of St. Teresa in Winona, Mn., I decided to go into Elementary Education with a major in Early Childhood. After graduating, I came to St. Catherine's and taught 2<sup>nd</sup> grade. When the School Board decided they wanted to increase their enrollment, they decided to start a Kindergarten. It was then that my dream of teaching Kindergarten became a reality. Today we would probably say it was on "my bucket list!" To help us begin the kindergarten, we were blessed to have an anonymous donor to help us with the cost.

After teaching at St. Catherine's, I went to Illinois and taught 1st grade in Washington, where I had gone to school. In fact, I taught 1st grade in the same classroom where I had been a 1st grader! I taught at St. Patrick's in Washington for 3 years. Then the community asked me to become the Vocation Director, so that brought me back to North Dakota. For the next 10 years, I was in Grand Forks at the Newman Center (1986-96) doing Vocation Ministry and Campus Ministry. In 1996, I left the Newman Center and returned to Maryvale, where I was appointed the Assistant Provincial for 5 years.

In 2001, I went on a 9-month Sabbatical in St. Louis to discern where God was leading me. Sight unseen, I accepted a position in Parish Ministry in a small town of Fosston, Minnesota. For 12 years I served 2 small parishes as the Pastoral Associate. Then, after a mini-Sabbatical, God surprised me, and I accepted a position as the Pastoral Care Director at St. Gabriel's Long Term Care facility in Bismarck. After 5 years in Bismarck, I came back to Valley City and am currently the Pastoral Care Director at St. Raphael Long Term Care facility. When one is open, it is amazing where God's journey leads. It is one awesome adventure!"

My years at St. Catherine's hold many special, sacred memories. Being part of a faith-filled community helped me to grow spiritually and emotionally. I will forever treasure the years I spent at St. Catherine's and the students that I taught. Thank you for allowing me to be part of your faith community and your history.

Thank you so much for your support in making all of this possible.




