From Father Mike's Desk



As we journey past Thanksgiving and into Advent, we find yet another reason to give thanks. The numbers are in, following our autumn fundraiser to support our youth ministries (school, religious education,

youth group, etc.). The amazing generosity of Saint Martha parishioners was again evident as we surpassed our goal of raising \$75,000. With final numbers nearly settled, it appears that we grossed approximately \$95,781, with about \$3,500 in expenses, leaving a net of about \$92,000. This money will allow us to maintain an affordable tuition in the school, will help us purchase new curricular materials in the school in religious education, will fund additional training as we continue to grow our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, and much more. Thank you, thank you, thank you!

And now it's Advent - the rich and rewarding season that is so easy to overlook in a society that celebrates secular "Christmas" beginning sometime in November and ends it just when Christians are actually beginning to celebrate the Nativity of the Lord. Advent is the time to prepare, to anticipate, to make ready. As we sing the Advent hymn "People Look East," we hear the call to "make your house fair as you are able, trim the hearth and set the table." We're to "set every peak and valley humming with the word, the Lord is coming!"

One way to avoid leaping prematurely into the Christmas season is to take full advantage of the joys of the Advent season. As we talked about last week, there are several easy steps: Begin dinner with the lighting of the Advent wreath. For the smallest members of the family, use a Christian Advent calendar to mark progress through the season. Put up your crèche in slow motion, starting with just the outer structure, then take all of Advent to slowly populate it.

Choose among the many Catholic sources of daily reflection (Magnificat, This Day, Word on Fire, Dynamic Catholic, the Catholic Store, Formed, EWTN, etc.) and give yourself a prayerful start each morning. If your schedule allows it, come to daily Mass (or at least sit with the readings each day), sing the Advent hymns, and join Mary and Joseph as they make their way to Bethlehem.

May God bless you!


