FROM FATHER MIKE'S DESK:



In a few days, it will be Ash Wednesday, and we will begin again our Lenten journey to the Mount of Calvary and the glory of the Resurrection.

Our friends at Dynamic Catholic are fond of the phrase "Best Lent Ever!" Perhaps this year we can borrow that sentiment and plan a particularly grace-filled forty days for ourselves.

As we all know, the three traditional components of a good Lent are Prayer, Fasting, and the giving of Alms. Of course, our first day of prayer is Ash Wednesday itself. Mass will be celebrated four times that day, with ashes distributed at each Mass. We will have a 7:00 am. Mass for those on the way to work. An 8:30 am Mass will follow - come celebrate with our school children! The next Mass is at 12:00 noon. Then we will conclude with a 6:00 pm Mass. Think about coming to the first convenient Mass that day - the earlier you receive ashes, the greater your witness that day.

As Lent goes along, our prayer can take many forms. Consider daily Mass. Twenty-five minutes of the Word and the Eucharist. Ours is at 8:30 am. most weekdays. Other parishes in the area offer Mass as early as 6:30 am, and at many other times during the day and evening. In my experience, many of the people who regularly attend daily Mass will tell you that they decided to come during some Lent, years ago, and loved it so much they never stopped coming.

Eucharistic Adoration is another wonderful way to be with the Lord. We offer Adoration on Wednesday evenings and First Fridays. There also is evening Adoration (6:00 to 9:00 pm) every day but Saturday at our sister parish up the road -- Saint Mary Williamston. Or, even without the Blessed Sacrament exposed in the Monstrance, just come to our church during the day. In the stillness, share your heart with the Lord, and listen to His love as it pours out upon you.

Stations of the Cross are prayed every Friday afternoon in Lent at 2:30 pm with the school children, and every Friday evening in Lent at 7:00 pm. If you combine those 7:00 pm Stations with dinner at our Fish Fry, you'll have a nearly perfect evening!!

(And, yes, it's true: Saint Martha does have the finest Fish Fry in North America. Persons who have visited every church, school, chapel, mission, cathedral, basilica, and outpost of the Holy Roman Catholic Church across every state, province, and territory of the United States, Canada, and Mexico have unanimously reported that no one's fish fry is as delicious, and no one's fish fry is marked by such warm fellowship. For real. It's a scientific fact.)

The Friday evening Stations of the Cross take a wonderful turn on March 17 when we will pray the Scriptural Stations of Saint John Paul the Great, accompanied by a four-voice schola leading us in Praise and Worship music! Those Stations are just one element of the 24 Hours for the Lord - begun several years ago by Pope Francis, and carried along ever since here at Saint Martha. Adoration will begin at 3:00 pm on Friday, March 17 and continue until the same time on Saturday, March 18. Confessions will be heard at several points during those 24 hours, and there will be other devotions as well.

Finally, as to prayer, think about adding some lectio divina this Lent. Take one Gospels, and begin reading. Slowly. Very slowly. When something touches your heart, stop. Just prayer over that phase or sentence. A few minutes in the morning will be an immense enrichment.

Fasting has a few possible components. Of course, there are the required elements of fasting and abstinence: Persons 14 and older must abstain from meat on all Fridays of Lent, including Good Friday. And persons 18 to 60 must fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday -- limit themselves to one normal-sized meal and two smaller portions that, together, do not exceed the main meal. (https://www.simplycatholic.com/fasting-and-abstinence-more-than-laws-of-the-church/)

Past that, however, we all can tighten up our intake of food and recreational beverages. And we certainly can find other things from which to fast. Perhaps, either entirely or partially, we can think about a fast from social media, or from political news, or from televised sports, or from Netflix or YouTube, or from foul language, or from something else over which we know - being honest with ourselves - we need to regain a measure of control.

The giving of Alms can take several forms. Perhaps give some financial help to an outstanding and truly Catholic school, charity, or religious order. If you haven't already done so, perhaps take that next step and (please) move to a recurring on-line parish contribution.

And, besides the giving of financial alms, consider a contribution of time and talent. At Saint Martha, we have wonderful ministries of all sorts. Ask Hallie or Jackie or me or any of us, and we'll find a rewarding slot for you. And, just down at the other end of Lake Lansing Road, is Cristo Rey Community Center. Under the guidance of our parishioner Joe Garcia (and with the blessed ministry of the Alma Mercy physicians) CRCC can use hands in its food pantry, clothes closet, and all its other Matthew 25 charitable work.

Anything else? Sure, lots more - ask the Holy Spirit where to take your Lent! Maybe catch some of The Search presentations in the Blessed Solanus Casey room on Thursday evenings. And, for sure, get to Confession this Lent. Lastly (and we'll say more when we get closer) it's not too soon to mark your calendars for April 6 to 9 - Holy Thursday evening, Good Friday afternoon, and the Easter Vigil. Along with Easter Sunday itself, these are the most powerful liturgies of the entire Church year.




