FROM FATHER MIKE'S DESK:



Here are three paragraphs that grabbed my attention at the beginning of a recent Catholic News Agency article --

After Nigeria was recognized as having the highest Mass attendance in the world, the African nation's youngest cardinal shared some of the secrets behind his country's vibrant sacramental life.

A recent study found that 94% of Nigeria's 30 million Catholics say they attend Mass at least weekly or more, while only 17% of American Catholics attend Mass weekly.

Cardinal Peter Ebere Okpaleke, 59, who leads the southern Nigerian diocese of Ekwulobia, sees three key factors behind the active participation of Catholics in Nigeria.

Wow. I suppose that, at the outset, one can note the 17% figure. Perhaps a useful question, in the American context, would be "What do you mean by 'Catholic'?" As we see with studies of Catholic voting behavior, the results can shift, depending on whether one considers everyone who was ever Baptized as Catholics, or the smaller set of self-described Catholics, or the still smaller set of Catholics who actually come to church and believe what the Church teaches.

Still, anyone with eyes can readily see that Mass attendance in this country is far below what it should be.

So what is Cardinal Okpaleke seeing when he looks at his faithful Nigerian parishioners? As noted in the article excerpt, he sees three principal explanations.

First, the Cardinal speaks of an awareness of God's presence. Across Nigerian society -- rich and poor, educated and uneducated -- there is a sense of God's presence in everyday life. He says, "There is a general awareness of the role of the divine in human life. It is this awareness that translates into Mass attendance for Catholics, who come to Mass to encounter Christ in the Eucharist." He suggests that we emphasize the role of the Church as a means of satisfying the "inner hunger" that we all have for the transcendent.

Second, the Cardinal notes the strong sense in the Nigerian Catholic community of the family being "the domestic church." His suggestion is that we "pay pastoral attention to the family as domestic church because that is where everyone's faith experience is formed."

And, third, the Cardinal speaks of a deep sense of community found in the local parishes. He says that Nigerian parishes provide "community and belongingness."

If we look at Saint Martha Parish and School in those lights, we might find the first item most challenging. While modern Americans certainly have a deep attachment to religion, too often it is a false religion of either neo-paganism or issue activism. Daily, we encounter people who are willing to believe anything except the Faith that their parents taught them. If we are to chip away at this current malady, it probably will be through the advice given by the Teacher after He healed the demoniac of Gerasenes -- *Go home to your family, and tell them all that God, in his mercy, has done for you.* Mark 5:19. Through our witness to the One who offers authentic peace, perhaps we change a heart or two.

Regarding the domestic church, we are trying. The covenant of Saint Martha School and the whole-family character of Faith Formation are both intended to support parents as they teach and nurture the Gospel in their children. As you look around your home, ask whether a visitor would notice that yours is a Catholic Christian home. The presence of sacramentals and sacred images, the frequency of verbal prayer, and the ease with which the Lord's blessings are discussed, are all good measures of whether a home is truly functioning as the domestic church. If you ever wonder about "domestic church," please talk to any of us on staff, and we'll happily share some ideas.

As to the parish as community, this is where our patron Saint Martha and her Bethany siblings can show us the way. Though we always reach a healing hand to our strange and fractured world, it is here at Saint Martha that we find so many opportunities for fellowship. Anyone who has helped with one of our ministries, or who has joined a study group, has found faithful men and women with whom bonds of friendship are easily formed. To this day, I am friends with the parents of other children who were in the same grade as mine in our shared Catholic school. For young couples looking to build quality friendships, there is no better place than here, in the Eucharistic presence of the Lord. The more active we are in our parish, the more we treasure our connections to the wonderful people who come here!

Our Nigerian brothers and sisters do seem to have a good thing going. Let's see what we can do to raise ourselves to their level! Blessings!


