FROM FATHER MIKE'S DESK:

This weekend we come to the Sunday of many names -- the Second Sunday of Easter, Sunday within the Octave of Easter, Low Sunday, Thomas Sunday (because it's always the Gospel of Thomas and his questions), Quasimodo Sunday (from the old days -- the opening words of the Collect in Latin). And, more recently, as the wisdom of the Spirit moved Saint John Paul the Great, Divine Mercy Sunday.

At its core, Divine Mercy is obviously the unfathomable and incalculable mercy of Christ. Saint Faustina wrote movingly of it, and we get to share in receiving and spreading those graces as we pray the beautiful Chaplet of Divine Mercy over our families, friends, and world.

There are many other ways of formally acknowledging Divine Mercy, such as the prayer services held in many Catholic churches on this Sunday -- ours is down the road at Saint Mary Williamston from 3:00 to 4:00 p.m. The Chaplet will be prayed and Reconciliation offered, during an hour of Adoration. And, as you know, that's the program every Wednesday evening here at Saint Martha, following the 6:00 p.m. Mass -- Adoration, Reconciliation, Chaplet.

Among the endless lessons of the Gospels is that Christ's ministry on earth was largely shaped by His desire to teach us by example. He taught and healed and shared and forgave and guided and loved so that we could learn how to teach and heal and share and forgive and guide and love. In the same way, He poured out mercy so that we could learn to be merciful, gentle, kind, patient with each other.

I spoke recently with a Saint Martha parishioner who is a foreign student working on a graduate degree at MSU. Like all of us, he was quite shaken by the tragic shootings at MSU. With some sadness, he recounted the difficulty of honestly sharing his thoughts and feelings with others on campus -- it appeared to him that, too often, as he tried to discuss the various aspects of the event, the listener would simply be waiting to hear him say something that would reveal him to be a liberal or a conservative. Like most of the thoughtful, prayerful people you know, this parishioner has nuanced views on a wide variety of issues, and his outlook doesn't fit neatly into any conventional category.

Increasingly, this seems to be an area in which our whole nation needs to learn mercy, gentleness, kindness, patience. Too often, on discovering that a person leans Left or leans Right on one issue, we leap to a whole raft of premature conclusions about the person. The beauty and strength of these United States is the immense variety of outlooks found across this great continent. The same must be said of the Church.

James Joyce famously described the Church in the phrase, "Here comes everybody!" As the largest organization of any kind on the face of the earth, the Catholic Church includes every sort of person, united only in the One who is our salvation -- Jesus Christ. All those who accept His Truth -- the dogmatic and moral teachings treasured by the Church through long ages -- are united with us in a profound way, regardless of their tastes in worship, devotion, or music.

We had a great opportunity to learn this lesson during Covid. Out of any hundred people, there were a hundred different degrees and expressions of caution. No matter where we fell on the scale, we always could see persons who were more cautious than us and persons who were less cautious. And the expressions of caution were all over the place. Personally, there were things that I was comfortable doing, but others were not. Conversely, I avoided certain things that I could see did not bother others. We were all over the place. And, as it turned out, none of us was definitively proven to have been right or wrong.

We continue to see the need for mercy within the Church. The recent dust-up over the Latin Mass is a perfect example. Some Catholics of good faith love the ancient beauty and soft reverence of the Latin Mass. Others are unmoved by it, and are entirely comfortable with the Novus Ordo (the Mass as it is prayed in nearly every Catholic church). Many, correctly recognizing that each is a source of eternal grace, attend both. Personally, I do not pray or attend the Latin Mass of my youth, but I entirely respect the choice of those who do.

Closer to home, we can enjoy our robust diversity as we receive the Eucharist. On the hand? On the tongue? Standing? Kneeling? The Lord loves all, and so should we. (As I mentioned some weeks ago, we're gonna give those who kneel a break, by putting a couple of small kneelers up in front.) The Church is such a rich treasury of styles. As we sometimes observe, the Heavenly census includes persons who prayed the Rosary daily and persons who almost never prayed the Rosary. In like manner, Heaven includes Fourth Degree Knights, and men who lived in solitude. Blessed be the God who made us all so different! *In my Father's house, there are many rooms.* John 14:2.

On this Divine Mercy Sunday, let's recommit ourselves to being patient and merciful with each other. Let's try harder not to place labels on individuals based on a couple things they may have said or done. Let's celebrate and cherish the amazing breadth of humanity, both in our nation and in our Church. Or, in the inspired words of Saint Augustine, so cherished by Saint John XXIII -- *In essentials, unity; in non-essentials, liberty; in all things, charity.*
