#### FROM FATHER MIKE'S DESK:



So why do priests keep coming back to the topic of Confession (Reconciliation)? Some Catholics go regularly, some go at intervals, some never go. Everyone seems satisfied where he or she is. Why not just let it be?

Well, a few things come to mind. Like I remember one time when I was sent to speak with a non-retired priest whose (mal)formation had occurred in the bad old days of the 60s / 70s. I asked him why he was hearing Confessions for only one hour a *month*. His response was immediate, "Because no one comes." There is a certain elegance to that sort of perfectly circular reasoning, but still....

Saint John Marie Vianney is, famously, the only diocesan priest to have ever been canonized. And thus, obviously, he is the patron saint of diocesan priests. His story is well known. Like Blessed Solanus Casey, he was given an assignment to fit what was thought to be his low intelligence. Sent to Ars as the curate (the parish priest), he was instrumental in bringing thousands into the Confessional, many for the first time in long years.

So, again, other than seeking to emulate the Cure' of Ars, why would a priest keep inviting people to Confession? Well, consider that the priest spends vastly more time in the Confessional than does any one penitent, regardless of how faithful the penitent might be to the Sacrament. So the priest sees, hears, and experiences the Sacrament deeply, participating over and over again in the flow of God's grace and mercy. And the priest comes to understand -- to the degree any human is able -- the immense power of the Sacrament. People walk out of the Confessional cleansed of all sin, renewed and refreshed. There truly is a lightness to their step.

As priests are wont to say, please come. If you haven't been in a long time -- even years -- don't suppose that you have forgotten how ("I don't remember what to say") or that it's somehow too late. Priests know how to guide a Confession that covers a long period of time, and they treasure the opportunity to be a channel of Christ's healing mercy. And keep in mind always that Confession is mercy. It is not counseling or therapy or correction. You and I and everyone has sinned. It's that divine mercy that we each need.

"Okay, Father, that's all quite interesting. But I am sorry for my sins, and I told God I'm sorry. Why isn't that enough?" It's not enough because, in human terms, we haven't really owned up to our misdeeds until we, first, name them to ourselves, and, second, acknowledge them to someone else. On a spiritual level, the answer is even simpler -- because Christ gave the Sacrament and said that it is the path to mercy and forgiveness. And, as each of us gradually comes to realize over the course of a lifetime, it turns out that Christ is wiser than any of us. Also He's God, and we're not.

At Saint Martha, Confessions are heard six days a week. And Confessions are heard often at the other parishes around town (nowadays, most priests are quite generous with Sacrament). You can even go far from home, while traveling, if that suits you better.

You already know that the Seal of Confession is absolute. No exceptions. None. And it's good to reflect sometimes on the opportunity, with the door closed, to have a conversation that is blessedly safe and private.

The Lord will never stop inviting Catholics to the immense gift of Confession. Neither will your priests. See you soon . . . .
