FROM FATHER MIKE'S DESK:

One of the most familiar passages of Scripture is found in Chapter 25 of the Gospel of Matthew. The Lord offers a scene of Final Judgment -- When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats.

You know how this goes. He will say to some, Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. And they will be among the blessed because they performed corporal acts of mercy for Christ in His times of need. When they protest that they do not recall having helped Christ, He will respond, Amen, I say to you, what you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me. And you know the rest of this passage -- it doesn't go well for those who were unwilling to help others in times of need. Matthew 25:31-46.

As Catholics, there are numerous ways for us to participate in this holy work. The broader community includes Advent House, Loaves and Fishes, several local food banks, and other opportunities. And lots more -- one of our parishioners travels with the Red Cross into disaster areas, often finding utter devastation. Closer to home, virtually every neighborhood includes persons whose health or economic circumstance leaves them in need of some assistance. Even closer in, our family and circle of friends surely offers opportunities to help in myriad ways.

Of course, we should be looking for a blend of outlets for our charity. Monetary donations often provide essential assistance. But we do well also to be personally present to those in need. It can be as simple as visiting a sick friend or as complicated as mentoring someone who is reassembling life after surviving addiction or other personal tragedy.

Within our parish, we are blessed to have a vibrant conference of the Saint Vincent de Paul Society. Prayerful and patient, our Vincentians provide an incredible amount of assistance to the poor of our community. An element of Vincentian spirituality is to do this with almost no visibility, so, even among Saint Martha parishioners, their work is almost unknown.

If you have ever thought about helping in this manner, you could begin by attending one of their Sunday morning meetings. You will greatly enjoy these good people, and be humbled to see what they do.

Another whole element of our conference is its faithfulness to the Vincentian Rule. Most people are unaware that the Saint Vincent de Paul Society isn't just another solid group of lay volunteers. Vincentians live by a Rule -- not a strict set of requirements for daily life, but a broad set of sound principles for Christian living, tailored to the Vincentian work. To give you a sense of what this is about, you need only take a glance at some of the chapter headings in the Rule --

Focusing on Christ as the Center
Listening to the Word of God
Loving at Home
Serving in the Workplace
Rooting Life in Prayer
Journeying with Friends
Having a Grateful Heart
Speaking the Truth
Trusting in God's Providence
Being Gentle and Firm

Thus, Saint Vincent himself was fond of saying Christ is the rule.

You can also consider volunteering at some of our local Catholic Charities. Many of you know our parishioner Joe Garcia, who heads up Cristo Rey Community Center on the north side of Lansing. Nearly any day, you can find Saint Martha parishioners there, helping serve meals or providing other needed services to those in need. There is so much to be done ...

A little farther away -- about forty-five minutes -- is the St. Luke N.E.W. Life Center. Under the direction of Sister Carol Weber, O.P. (and, until recently, Sister Judy Blake, S.S.J., of blessed memory), the poor of Flint are given all sorts of assistance. Even more importantly, there is vibrant programming in the realms of job skills and life skills, allowing persons long ensnared in the cycle of poverty to advance into responsible and remunerative employment.

So many outlets. Support a friend in distress. Become a Vincentian. Volunteer in north Lansing. None of us will do them all. Each of us should be doing some of it.


