

Greetings, St. Martha Parishioners!

I am so excited to serve as your next pastor!

Before I say anything about that, however, let me first acknowledge my dear friend, Fr. Mike Murray. What an extraordinary priest he is! He came into your lives and the life of St. Martha Parish and School

under very trying and difficult circumstances with one agenda item - to love you. Yes, there was a lot going on, and he did so many extraordinary things pastorally, administratively, and spiritually but the one thing he wanted to impress upon you was the Lord's love for you. One of the joys of being a priest, at least for me, are Catholic schools! I have a passion for Catholic schools. Catholic schools are first and foremost places of encountering Jesus Christ while at the same time places to prepare our future doctors, lawyers, nurses, teachers, scientists, police officers, firefighters, etc. as they will go out into the world to make Christ known by helping bring about the Kingdom here on earth. I am excited to see what the Holy Spirit has in store for St. Martha School! I am also very appreciative of Andrea Patton and the faculty and staff. I have heard nothing but great things about everyone!

This is already a longer introduction than I had anticipated, so I will stop here and say, once again, how excited I am to be your next pastor. Please pray for me and know that I have been praying and will continue to pray for all of you! Come, Holy Spirit!
