FROM FATHER RYAN'S DESK:



I cannot tell you how happy I am to finally be in Okemos! It was not easy saying goodbye to the high school students, but I am so excited to begin my time with you here at St. Martha Parish and School! I am in the process of getting unpacked and organized while at the same wrapping my head around everything here in the parish. Please have patience with me as we begin together. Fr. Mike, the Leadership Team, and the entire staff have made this transition very easy

and seamless, so a huge <u>thank you</u> to them. I owe a huge debt of gratitude to all of our volunteers, especially Ron Lenz, who puts in a tireless amount of time and energy into the parish and school that he so loves. Thank you!

I cannot wait to meet everyone! Andrea and our school faculty and staff might not appreciate me writing this especially at the beginning of July, but I am excited for school to start and all the parish programming to pick back up. But, there is still some golf to be played...so we won't rush things.

In our second reading this weekend, St. Paul reminds us that we "are not in the flesh; on the contrary, [we] are in the spirit, if only the spirit of God dwells in [us]" (Romans 8:9). For the baptized, God does indeed dwell within us! At the moment of our baptism we were washed from original sin, and God's very spirit was given to us as we were made His adopted sons and daughters. What an amazing gift!

Cardinal Raniero Cantalamessa, the Papal Preacher, often calls baptism an *unreleased sacrament* in that so often it is or becomes tied. It can be tied in the sense that the fruit that should accompany the sacrament faith, hope, love, discipleship, holiness, repentance - remains bound because of certain blockages or obstacles that prevent its effectiveness. Remember that sacraments are not magical rituals. Rather, they are rites which require a response on our part. Cardinal Cantalemessa writes the sacraments' "effectiveness is the fruit of a synergy or cooperation between divine omnipotence - in reality the grace of Christ or the Holy Spirit - and human freedom, because as St. Augustine said, 'The one who created you without your cooperation, will not save you without your cooperation'" (Baptism in the Holy Spirit, Cantalamessa).

St. Paul reminds us that we live in a covenantal relationship with our God - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. On God's part, in the sacrament of baptism, He does three things for us: 1) forgives our sins, 2) imparts the theological virtues of faith, hope, and love, and 3) recapitulates us back to the Father as His adopted sons and daughters.

What's our part? Namely faith. Not simply a spoken faith but rather a faith lived out as His intentional disciples. We could reasonably sum that up by the word *holiness*. To live in the Spirit is to strive after holiness by responding to the gift that God has given us - life.

So, are we living in the flesh or the Spirit? There are many obstacles that bind each one of us from time to time. Let's pray for each other to choose to live in the Spirit every day we wake up! And, let's not forget that, in God's infinite goodness, He gave us the gift of the sacrament of reconciliation to restore us to our original baptismal dignity. We have such a good God!

I am looking forward to meeting you all soon!




